LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Regular Legislative Session is due to end this week on Thursday, June 8th. No tax increase bills have passed so far. In anticipation of this, Governor Edwards recently called a Special Legislative Session to start immediately after the Regular Legislative Session ends. If the House of Representatives version of the budget is not compromised in the Regular Legislative Session, the governor will precede with the Special Legislative Session.

Minimum wage increase and equal pay bills have also not gained any traction at the Legislature this session. Minimum wage legislation failed in Senate

Finance Committee and the equal pay bill is parked on the Senate floor. The equal pay legislation would have expanded the law to private employers and men employees. The minimum wage bill would have raised wages to \$8.00 per hour in 2018 and to \$8.25 starting in 2019.
