


### Huntsville Leadership Institute 2017-2018 - Class Project OPTIONS

We are all honored to be in this year's HLI Class 36 where we have met so many new classmates who have become our friends. We have also learned so much about our community and its strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats and how we are able to help make a difference.

"OPTIONS Day is put on annually by each class that goes through HLI; it is a way to put into practice what we preach in HLI, being leaders within our community. Although, the preparation for OPTIONS took hard work, it was the reward of seeing how the outcome impacted the students that mattered" stated Gabby Garcia from Region VI ESC, one of the HLI organizers.



As always, we want to say "Thank You" to many of the speakers who attended for the day, you helped us make the day a true success.

Kristin Mizrany is an LVN at Creekside and this was her first time to attend OPTIONS. She said that since the opening in 2013, they are able to offer a comfortable, secure; family-style senior living that empowers residents to be as independent as possible. They will continue to pour their hears into everything they do, so that their residents get the most out of each day and they encourage everyone to stop by and visit them soon.

Dione Traylor is a Paramedic from Walker County EMS and this is her second time attending OPTIONS. She said that she loves to educate people about what she does and she is also an instructor to teach others about being a paramedic.

Chasity William is the Community Relations Director for the Saafe House and she told me that they are more than a shelter or a crisis intervention agency. They are an advocate for the family and would love to come speak to any groups about what they do.

Natosha Hubbard and Marcus Jamison represented Sam Houston State University from Residence Life. They provide each resident with a convenient, well-maintained, and safe living environment at a reasonable cost while fostering learning by setting and upholding community standards, providing community activities, and encouraging campus connections and opportunities to enhance the student's overall experience of university life.

First time OPTIONS attendee Kerri Johnson said that she has been a teacher for 32 years and she teaches accounting and Microsoft Office 2016 at the high school in Groveton and she loves teaching. Her best experience at OPTIONS was when a young lady came up to her and told her that she wanted to be an English teacher and teach in South Korea.

Phillip Burnett enjoyed his first time at OPTIONS. He was representing the Sandy Creek Angus Ranch which is owned by the Burnett family in Richards, Texas.
