


NAIOP'S ADVOCACY

NAIOP REPRESENTS THE INTERESTS OF THE COMMERCIAL REAL ESTATE INDUSTRY AT THE FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL LEVELS. THROUGH REGULATORY, LEGISLATIVE, AND JUDICIAL ADVOCACY, NAIOP WORKS TO ADVANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, STRENGTHEN COMMUNITIES, AND ENSURE THAT ISSUES FACING THE INDUSTRY ARE UNDERSTOOD BY LEADING POLICYMAKERS.

IN THE FIRST HALF OF THE 2023/2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION, NAIOP SUCCESSFULLY ADVOCATED FOR THE ENACTMENT OF CRITICAL LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES MEANT TO LAY A STRONG FOUNDATION FOR HOUSING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN THE YEARS TO COME, WHILE BLOCKING ATTEMPTS TO WEAKEN MASSACHUSETTS' COMPETITIVENESS.

- Filed legislation to protect Special Permits and Site Plan Review Approvals from retroactive zoning.
- Tripled the Housing Development Incentive Program's annual allocation and secured a onetime spend clearing out the 1700+ housing unit backlog.
- Increased the Low Income Housing Tax Credit cap to \$60 million.
- Secured a five year extension of the Brownfields Tax Credit.
- Recapitalized the MassWorks Program for municipal infrastructure projects.
- Blocked an amendment seeking to increase the deeds excise tax statewide.
- Prevented language affecting commercial real estate transactions from advancing.
- Defeated attacks meant to weaken MBTA Communities Act.
- Worked with business, and civic groups across
 Massachusetts to advance the
 Commonwealth's competitiveness.



Regulatory & Judicial Efforts

IN 2023, NAIOP ENGAGED IN ONGOING REGULATORY EFFORTS ACROSS STATE AGENCIES AND SUBMITTED A "FRIEND OF THE COURT" AMICUS BRIEF TO THE SUPREME JUDICIAL COURT. NAIOP'S WORK ENSURED THAT THE COMMERCIAL REAL ESTATE INDUSTRY WAS REPRESENTED ACROSS ALL BRANCHES OF STATE GOVERNMENT.

- Appointed to Healey-Driscoll
 Administration's Economic
 Development Planning Council.
- Advised revision of MBTA Communities Guidance.
- Shaped Healey-Driscoll Administration's Affordable Homes Act - a \$4 billion Housing Bond Bill.
- Weighed in on regulatory development of 10-Community Fossil Fuel Ban Pilot.
- Provided feedback on the administration of the Brownfields Tax Credit.
- Served as subject matter experts for Healey-Driscoll Administration and agencies, including the Executive Offices of Housing, Energy and Environmental Affairs, and Economic Development.
- Submitted an amicus brief in Columbia Plaza Associates v. Northeastern University.
- Member of the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center BETA: Commercial Buildings Pilot Advisory Committee.
- Stakeholder in MassHousing's development of the Massachusetts Climate Bank.
