Corruption Crackdown

Last fall, former Illinois State Senator Martin Sandoval's home, district office and Springfield office were raided in a seemingly sudden FBI investigation. In January, Sandoval resigned right before he was charged with bribery. This past week he <u>plead guilty</u> to accepting a series of bribes from a red-light camera company and others. In total, Sandoval accepted \$250,000 in exchange for his political influence. Sandoval issued an apology and plead guilty. With his guilty plea, Sandoval becomes the first convicted from the recent, stillexpanding corruption probe in the State of Illinois.

This sets the scene for the start of Spring Legislative Session. Over the course of the next five months, legislators are tasked with passing legislation that will ideally improve our state. Calls for ethics reform are plenty as they reach a new high. As legislative proposals come in for the new year, proposals to try and crackdown on corruption are sure to come.
