Gearing Up for Phase 3

Currently all four regions of the state are set to enter Phase 3 of the <u>Restore Illinois</u> plan next Friday. This week brought Governor Pritzker's announcement that the plan is being amended in some capacity.

In Phase 3 <u>restaurants and bars</u> will have the option of hosting outdoor dining so long as social distancing and municipal guidelines are followed. Additionally, <u>golfing</u> foursomes will now be allowed on the course with golf carts permitted with one individual per cart.

Illinoisans are still encouraged to get outside as all state parks will open on May 29, and boating and camping activities will be allowed for groups of up to ten. <u>Child-care facilities</u> will also be allowed to open with no more than 10 children per classroom.

Phase 3 also allows for non-essential establishments, close contact services, and some fitness centers to reopen under strict social distancing and public health guidance.

On Sunday the State released industry specific guidelines for phase 3 opening.
