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# **HEALS Act vs. HEROES Act**

Negotiations continue for the next phase of COVID-19 relief funding. House Democrats led the passage of the \$3 trillion HEROES Act (Health and Economic Recovery Omnibus Emergency Solutions Act) in the House of Representatives in May. Last week, Senate Republicans unveiled the HEALS Act (Health, Economic Assistance, Liability Protection and Schools), with a price tag of at least \$1 trillion. The final negotiated bill may incorporate elements of each of these proposals.

Understanding the <u>elements</u> of each bill and their differences is vital, you can find more information <u>here</u>. Negotiations are ongoing with <u>Democrats and Republicans disagreeing</u> on aid for jobless Americans, liability protections for businesses, and relief for state and local governments.

Speaker Nancy Pelosi has raised the possibility that <u>August recess</u> may be delayed so an agreement can be reached.
