## The State of Stimulus

The past week brought a variety of talks regarding the potential for another stimulus bill. It has been about five months since the last stimulus package was passed, and discussions have been ongoing since. The President and Congressional leaders all expressed their thoughts on the possibility of another package.

After his return to the White House, President Trump shared in a series of tweets that <a href="negotiations">negotiations</a> should be halted before then requesting a series of stand-alone, targeted relief bills to sign. In response, Speaker Pelosi stated that stand-alone relief for airlines is not possible without a larger, comprehensive <a href="stimulus bill">stimulus bill</a>, and Leader McConnell said that any stimulus is <a href="unlikely">unlikely</a> is the next three weeks before the election.

Even with these statements, negotiations continue, five months after the initial relief package.
