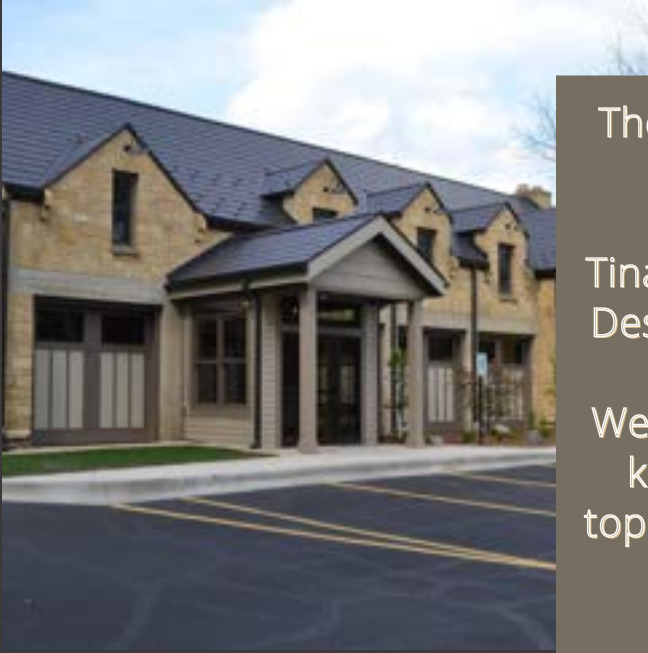

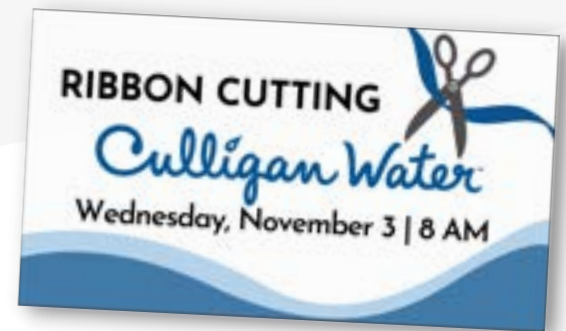

(Sparta, WI) St. Clare Health Mission of Monroe County began providing free medical care and medicines for Monroe County residents in November 1996. The clinic, modeled after St. Clare Health Mission in La Crosse, was founded by Dr. Pat Raftery a family medicine physician in Sparta. Clinic volunteers and supporters remain committed today to the belief that health care is a right regardless of ability to pay and that all people should be treated with dignity and respect. On the first and third Tuesday evening of each month volunteers continue to provide free medical care and prescription medicines for low-income, uninsured adults from Monroe County at the Mayo Clinic Health System-Sparta campus. Registration for the walk-in clinic is 5:00 – 6:30 pm. No appointments are necessary, and interpreters are available each evening.

Deborah Lutjen, Clinic Coordinator notes, "As the clinic celebrates 25 years of caring, we want to thank the many community members who donated time to volunteer at the clinic, who raised funds to support the clinic and purchase prescription medications, who provided lunches for the evening clinic volunteers, and who continue to support the clinic through financial donations and grants."

Currently over 40 community members volunteer at the twice monthly clinics. Church and community groups provide an evening lunch for volunteers who arrive after working a full day at their regular jobs. Michael Saunders, MD, Medical Director notes, "St. Clare Health Mission could not exist without all who give their time, talents and treasures to help those in need. We are thankful for their dedication."

Nearly doubling the troop training total from fiscal year 2020, Fort McCoy supported the training of 116,053 troops on post during fiscal year 2021. During fiscal year 2020, 60,054 troops trained at Fort McCoy because training was scaled back due to the COVID-19 pandemic. During fiscal year 2021, with existing COVID-19 mitigation measures in place, the installation brought back training levels to beyond 100,000 troops.

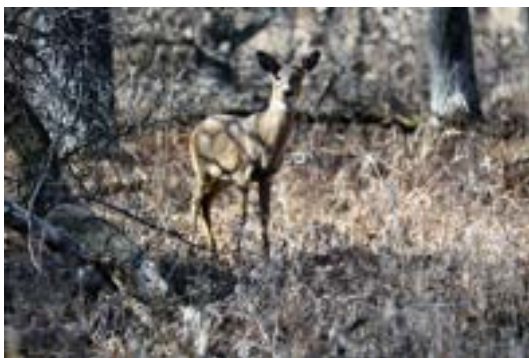


2021 Archery Deer Season Underway at Fort McCoy

The regular archery/crossbow archery season began at Fort McCoy on Sept. 18 at the same time as the opening of the Wisconsin archery season. The season runs from Sept. 18 to Nov. 19 and Nov. 29 to Jan. 31, 2022.

A Fort McCoy archery permit and a Wisconsin bow or crossbow hunting license are required to hunt on Fort McCoy for regular archery/crossbow. Harvest is limited to one deer (antlered or antlerless) with the appropriate deer harvest authorization supplied with the Fort McCoy archery permit.

Fort McCoy offers hunting, fishing, and trapping opportunities to military (active and retired) and their dependents, government employees, and the general public. Revenue generated from the sale of hunting, fishing, and trapping permits is used for the management of fish and wildlife habitat and populations on Fort McCoy.
