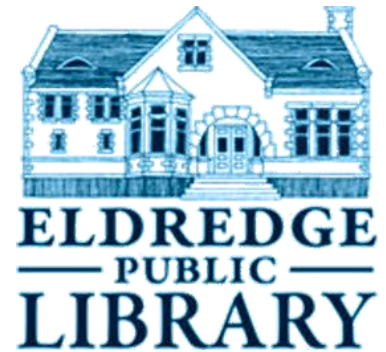
Eldredge Public Library:
