

In 1860, John Sikes recorded a plat with the Scott County Recorder. On it Sikes wrote, "I am going to start me a town, and I am going to call it Sikes Town." From that dream the city of Sikeston was founded. In 1875, the town of Sikeston, with a population of 250, was incorporated by the State of Missouri. In the 1920's Sikeston experienced a period of great prosperity and economic growth. At that time the city was home to more millionaires per capita than any city of its size within the U.S. Travel the cobblestone streets and view the historic homes from Sikeston's storied past. The tour also includes historic parks, churches, public buildings and other points of interest. Sikeston Historic Home Tour brochures are available at area hotels, the Sikeston CVB office, 128 N. *Sikeston Depot Museum* 116 W. Malone, Sikeston (573) 481-9967 Explore the history of Sikeston & Southeast Missouri at this restored 1916 Iron Mountain Railroad Train Depot. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Free admission.
