
Eric is proud that he has three employees who have been with him since he owned McPete's and a couple others who have been with him for 20 years. He employs 25 full and part-time employees.

Property tax relief

Minnesota businesses will see another reduction in their statewide property tax. Minnesota business property taxes are among the highest in the nation, and second highest for some properties. The state levy represents about 27% of a total property tax bill. The state business property tax levy will be reduced from \$784 million to \$737 million for taxes payable in 2020. Businesses will see this reduction on their tax statements this fall.

Health insurance premiums


Reinsurance will be extended two years, continuing to stabilize the individual health insurance market. Since its enactment in 2017, the program has done exactly what it was designed to do. It brought down premiums in the individual market by roughly 20% in 2018 and another 20% this year. The relief provided will be a factor once again as health insurance policies are renewed for 2020.

DOG VACCINATION CLINIC City/Township of Big Lake

The 14TH Annual Big Lake Dog Vaccination Clinic will be held Saturday, September 7, 2019 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon at Lions Community Park, 21960 County Road 5. Barrington Oaks Veterinary Hospital, Elk River, will provide vaccination services at this event.

<u>All dogs must be on a leash.</u> Only healthy dogs will be vaccinated. A Dog License is required for Township residents to be eligible for the discounted vaccinations.

Township residents will be able to purchase a dog license for \$20 on site the day of the event.

CASH PAYMENT REQUIRED.

NO CHECKS, DEBIT, OR CREDIT CARDS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Vaccination prices from the <u>2018</u> clinic:
One year Rabies (\$10) Canine DHPP (\$16) Canine Lymes (\$30)
2019 Vaccination costs are expected to be "similar" to last year.
