Did you know that the county seat was originally in Big Lake until it was moved to Elk River in 1865, 9 years after the Territorial Legislature set the current Sherburne County boundaries? Imagine what would Big Lake look like if the county seat hadn't been OUNT moved 150+ years ago...

"Big Lake is a growing community that offers a great location to live, work, and play," Assistant Sherburne County Administrator Dan Weber offered. "The population growth is driving the need for additional business and development growth. It has a great central location between the Twin Cities and St. Cloud while offering many parks and natural resources for residents to enjoy. We are proud to be a partner with the Big Lake Community."

Named after Moses Sherburne, an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the Minnesota Territory, Sherburne County celebrated 166 years late last month.

Sherburne County spans 431 square miles and has a population of more than 97,000, according to 2020 Census data. They offer economic development assistance/grants for businesses to start up, expand or relocate; grant programs to assist businesses and nonprofits with COVID-related challenges; renewal/issuance of driver's licenses; assistance to veterans in obtaining benefits; public safety/ law enforcement in all unincorporated areas and cities of Zimmerman and Clear Lake; prosecution of individuals who break the law; road and infrastructure maintenance and improvements; and maintaining, growing and improving a network of parks and trails, along with other services.

"We recently opened a child-care center in the Government Center in Elk River," noted Weber, "so parents who have business in our building can drop off their child with YMCA staff, (Continued on page 2)

who will make sure their child is safe and has constructive activities to do while their parents are busy. And it's FREE!"

Sherburne County employs 733 full-time employees and 22 part-time employees plus on-call and temporary or seasonal employees.

The County's 2022 budget is slightly more than \$113.6 million. Of this, 48% is funded through the property tax levy. The remainder is covered through state and federal grants and fees for services. \$2.8 million covers capital improvement debt.

County Administrator Bruce Messelt concluded, "The Big Lake Chamber has always offered numerous engagement and volunteer opportunities, and it has given us a chance to get involved with the community in so many ways. We've always admired the innovative programs that the Chamber develops. If there is something that needs to be done to support the community, the Big Lake Chamber is there to assist."

Kiffmeyer was elected to the Senate in 2012 after serving in the State House from 2009-2011. She previously served as Secretary of the State from 1999-2006. During her time as Secretary of State, Minnesota had the highest voter turnout in the nation. City of Big Lake's Music in the Park concert series is returning for a full season in 2022 to celebrate its 10-year anniversary! This free concert series is held on select Thursday evenings during the months of June-August and features a wide variety of live music and local food trucks. The concerts are held at Big Lake's scenic Lakeside Park located right off of Highway 10 and has drawn over 70,000 people from the surrounding areas including St. Cloud and the Twin Cities.

The Big Lake Farmers Market supports local farmers, crafters, and musicians and offers a variety of exciting programs that rely on sponsorships including the Power of Produce and Frequent Shopper programs, kids' activities, Music at the Market, Senior Day coupons, and our card reader. The Power of Produce incentive program provides kids ages 3 to 12 with \$2 tokens that can be spent on fresh fruits and vegetables at the market. In 2021 over 445 unique children participated and we reimbursed local farmers over \$2,700 in sales of their Minnesota grown produce. Each week, Music at the Market features live musicians. The Big Lake Farmers Market is proud to offer monetary compensation for each musicians' time and dedication to their passion. The market also invested in a card reader so that customers can use their debit-credit and SNAP-EBT cards to purchase goods from vendors who cannot afford this technology.
