

Whether you're looking for a Northwoods vacation or a small-town community lifestyle where you can live, work, and play, here in the Merrill area, you'll experience more to life.

With miles of scenic walking, biking, hiking, snowshoeing, cross country skiing, and horseback riding trails; ATV and snowmobile trails; the Wisconsin and Prairie Rivers which intersect in Merrill for boating, fishing, kayaking, canoeing, swimming, and tubing in the summer and ice fishing and ice drag racing in the winter; and more than a dozen area parks, including nearby Council Grounds State Park, the Ice Age Scenic Trail, the Underdown Recreation Area, endless area lakes, and Grandfather Falls, there are opportunities for outdoor recreation during every season.

Getting outdoors is easy and activities abound in and around Merrill. The natural scenery and outdoor landscape is amazing, whether you're sledding down Lion's Hill, looking out over the Prairie River from the Prairie Dells, or cross country skiing or snowshoeing along the Wisconsin River on the River Bend Trail.

Year round and seasonal events provide opportunities for live music, wine

Year round and seasonal events provide opportunities for live music, wine tastings, ice fishing contests, a county fair, hunting, Food Truck-a-Palooza, auto racing on the ice, parades, high school and semi-pro football games and other sporting events, 5K races, farmer's market, North Woods Art Tour, craft shows, 18-hole golf courses, seasonal food trucks, athletic clubs, gun shows, ice skating, hockey, quilt shows, horseback riding, rubber duck races, and much more.

The area is rich in history with many buildings and homes that preserve the area's heritage, a three-arch stone bridge, the Lincoln County Courthouse on the National Historic Registry which sits in the middle of the City of Merrill (the County seat), a genealogy research center at the historic T.B. Scott Library, and the Merrill Historical Society History and Culture Center open for tours and exploration of the history of the area.

Alexander Lake

Alexander Lake is a 677-acre reservoir on the Wisconsin River located just northwest of Merrill. Council Grounds State Park is on the east side of the lake with a fishing pier, boat landing, camping, and hiking and biking opportunities. The lake and river are home to walleye, northern pike, smallmouth bass, muskie, largemouth bass, bluegill, and crappie. Maximum lake depth is 37 ft.

Athletic Park

500 Logan St • Merrill

This local historic landmark features a lighted 5-acre baseball field and began hosting amateur and semi-pro baseball games in 1925. Completely surrounded by an eight-foot granite wall, constructed during the Great Depression by the Works Progress Administration, Athletic Park is one of the most scenic baseball fields in the State of Wisconsin. Athletic Park

is the home field for Merrill High School*, Legion Post 42, and the Merrill Rangers baseball teams.



Bankers Square 915 E Main St • Merrill

A tiny "pocket park" in the downtown shopping area, this is a great little place to eat lunch or have a picnic and to enjoy live music during the Chamber's summertime lunch concert series. Featuring a fabulous view of the Wisconsin River, the dam, and the River Bend Trail. Within easy walking distance of shopping, a bakery, a coffee shop, a wine bistro, and much more!



Bill Cross Wildlife Area

Bill Cross Wildlife Area is a 1,522acre property in Lincoln County that splits into two pieces by 2 1/2 miles of the Wisconsin River. Located about 8 miles northwest of Merrill, it can be accessed on the east side of the Wisconsin River from Hwy 107 and on the west side of the Wisconsin River from Tesch Rd. Largely northern hardwood and aspen forest, it encompasses 3 3/4 miles of river frontage and is mostly undeveloped with forested uplands adjoining the river, although there are several pine plantations within the property.

There is a small flowage on the southern end of the property on

the west side of the river, while the east-facing river bank tends to be steep, dropping some 100 feet in elevation to the river's edge. Small kettle wetlands are scattered on the property west of the river. Wetland types include open water with emergent wet meadows, or river meander scars with forested and emergent wetland types and shrub-carr.

The Bill Cross Wildlife Area is managed to provide opportunities for public hunting, trapping, fishing, and other outdoor recreation while protecting the qualities of the unique native communities and associated species found on the property. Go birding, view wildlife, and gather wild edibles.

landing, canoe and kayak rental, or one of the many fishing docks. Swim at the beach area, play on the playground, grill out or picnic, bike or rollerblade on the blacktop campground roads, enjoy hosted candlelight walks periodically through the year [cross country skiers welcome], hike, bike, fish, boat, canoe or kayak, cross country ski, showshoe, and more! A shelter house is available for rental. Seasonal or day park passes required. Council Grounds is also the access point to the annual Ice Drags events held in January and February. [No fee to drive through to access the frozen lake for this event.]

Grandfather Falls Recreation Area

Hwy 107 north of Merrill

This recreation area is home to the Wisconsin Public Service Dam and Hydro Plant. The Grandfather Falls Dam, one of 27 located on the Wisconsin River, has been producing electricity since 1906. Recreational opportunities in this area include hiking a scenic one-mile trail, fishing above and below the dam, and canoeing. There is a clearly marked kayak and canoe portage along the water pipeline. Be sure to keep an eye on your surroundings; this undeveloped area is an excellent place to catch a glimpse of a deer, bear, bald eagle, or even a timber wolf.

The Great Pinery Heritage Waterway™ is a navigable water trail located in Northcentral Wisconsin. Situated on the Wisconsin River and its tributaries, the trail spans several counties [including Lincoln County] and is 108 miles long.

A pleasant paddle for recreational and advanced paddlers alike with plentiful landings and clear signage. Immerse yourself in the natural beauty as you paddle through one of the diverse water trail segments including scenic forests, urban landscapes, and historic sites; learn about the native inhabitants and European settlers who once navigated these waters; and enjoy local attractions, food, and happenings.



Harrison Hills

Hills and valleys and small lakes, all formed by the glaciers that extended to the areas in years past, provide a unique topography in the Harrison Hills, located to the west of Hwy 17 between Merrill and Rhinelander. Lincoln County Hwy B winds through this hill country past many small glacial lakes, hugging the terrain as it winds through the hills, providing a wonderful driving experience through a beautiful landscape.

Explore, fish, boat, hunt, hike, bike, camp, showshoe, cross country ski, snowmobile, ride ATV and more in this year-round recreation area. Hikers can trek a 16-mile segment of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail that includes the trail's highest point, Lookout Mountain. At the top, an old fire tower allows visitors to look out over the treetops.



Haymeadow County Park

Ice Age Trail

The Ice Age Trail is a designated National Scenic Trail that will run some 1,200 miles through Wisconsin once completed. Administered by the National Park Service, it is constructed and maintained by numerous private and public agencies including, most notably, the Ice Age Trail Alliance, a non-profit memberand volunteer-based organization with 21 local chapters.

The Ice Age Trail traverses Lincoln County, passing north of Merrill along the Wisconsin River near Grandfather Falls. The highest point on the entire trail is Lookout Mountain, in Lincoln County, at 1,920 feet.

Jack Pines Park E Sixth St & Memorial Dr

A 7-acre county park with wildlife habitats and natural forest areas for enjoyment, and the hill there is a popular area for families and children to go sledding and sliding.



Lake Pesobic North of Merrill

A 147-acre lake with a maximum depth of 11 feet. Fish for panfish, largemouth bass, northern pike, and walleye. Access the lake from a public boat landing at the end of S Shore Dr.



Lincoln County

Lincoln County has 726 lakes and 246 streams, in addition to the Wisconsin and Prairie Rivers. These waterways provide many fishing possibilities from walk-in fishing to canoeing, to large boat fishing. The species of fish vary from pan fish to muskies. Enjoy a day out on the water with the family or just take some time out of a busy week and spend a few hours alone in nature. From Larson Lake easily accessible from Hwy K north of Merrill, to Turtle Lake, Bass Lake, and the abundance of lakes in the Harrison Hills area, to Tug Lake, Lake Pesobic, Knight Lake, and the literally hundreds of other lakes just a short drive from Merrill, fishing opportunities abound on rivers and streams for every fisher man, woman, or child.



Lincoln County Forest

Lincoln County Forest contains 101,000 acres. The forestland is open to the public for a multitude of recreational uses. These include snowmobiling, cross country skiing, mountain biking, camping, hunting, fishing, hiking, etc. Wildlife available to hunt during open seasons are deer, bear, grouse, squirrel, rabbit, turkey, and waterfowl.



Lincoln County Trail System

On those cold, blustery days, what better way to spend your time than to bundle up and hop on your snowmobile. Lincoln County has over 400 miles of groomed trails, so your adventure awaits! During your journey, you will find all sorts of terrain, from farm fields to lakes and streams to hardwood forests. Begin your trip with a stay at one of our local accommodations and a meal at one of the area's many restaurants. In winter the County offers 175 miles of groomed ATV trails. In addition, the County also offers a 43-mile summer ATV trail, that connects with Langlade and Oneida Counties' summer ATV trail systems. Lincoln County welcomes you to use our trails. Enjoy the scenery, ride safely, and respect the resources and other forest users.

Some city streets and Lincoln. County roads are also designated as ATV routes. The area is a very ATV/ UTV friendly community.



Lion's Park

210 W Third St . Merrill

A 13.8-acre park with Prairie River access, this park features an outdoor ice-skating rink and a sledding hill making it a popular place in winter. During summer months, five baseball diamonds serve Merrill's Little League program.

Merrill Area Recreation Complex* (MARC)/ Smith Center/Bierman Family Aquatic Center

The Merrill Area Recreation Complex (MARC*), set on 96 acres at the city's northwest edge, is a multi-use complex.

Outdoors, the MARC* features seven baseball and softball diamonds, three official soccer fields, playground equipment, and restroom facilities.

The soccer fields are used by the youth program and the Merrill High School teams. The Merrill Soccer Association has a building among the soccer fields to be used as a concession stand, restrooms, and an announcers booth.

A 2.5-mile trail for walking, hiking, biking, showshoeing, and cross country skiing links to Council Grounds State Park, which is adjacent to the MARC property. A 2.5-acre fenced dog park provides recreational space for large and small dogs.

The recreation complex is the home of the Smith Multi-Purpose Center and houses a rental space available for large functions, an indoor ice arena (Oct.-Mar.), a community room, and a refreshment stand.

Located at the Merrill Area Recreation Complex, the Bierman Family Aquatic Center opened in June 2016. This facility features a 7,400-square-foot outdoor pool area, 2,300-square-foot changing facility (with ticketing, mens/womens changing rooms/ restrooms/showers, two family changing rooms), along with an equipment/mechanical/ concession building. There is a double slide into water-filled runouts, a rock climbing wall, two diving boards, six-lane competitive lap swim area, zero depth splash pad area with playground, fumbling five dumping overhead buckets, and a family slide.

Memorial Forest Park is a 920-acre wildlife habitat area, with an 80-acre wetland, recently named the Don Manthei Recreational and Wetland

Over seven miles of new hiking and mountain biking trails were built in Merrill Memorial Forest in 2016. A new 5.1-mile loop of hiking and biking trail feature views of the Prairie Dells gorge. The one-mile marsh loop offers great views of the Manthei Marsh. A 2.5-mile trail connects the new trail to the existing trails in the Underdown Recreation Area north of Merrill. In contrast to the expert single-track trails in the Underdown, the new machine-built trails in the Merrill Memorial Forest are much more inviting to novice and intermediate mountain bikers. A great location for hiking, biking, snowshoeing, and more! It is located off County Trunk Hwy R

and is also a public hunting ground.

New Wood County Park

State Hwy 107 (10 miles north of Merrill) 715-539-1034

New Wood Camp county park has two covered shelters that are available by reservation. Electricity is not available. This park features an entrance to the Ice Age Trail, playground, water pump, and 10 campsites with primitive restrooms. It is located 10 miles northwest of Merrill on State Hwy 107. Campsites are first-come, first-served.



Normal Park

600 N Center Ave • Merrill

A Gazebo in this 2-acre park is the location for concerts by the Merrill City Band * and other live musical performances during the summer including a free evening summertime concert series.

It has an outdoor ice-skating rink in the winter and a ball diamond in the summer. A seasonal Farmer's Market is held at the park on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Annual cultural festivals, church services, and small wedding ceremonies are also held in the park and gazebo area. It is frequently used for small and impromptu picnics.

Located on the corner of Sixth St and Center Ave, Normal Park is adjacent to many of Merrill's historic homes. A new building with restrooms and a kitchen/space for concessions was built in 2017.

The park's newest addition, a 6,900-square-foot All-Access Playground, was completed in October 2019. The playground has many exciting features, including a ramp system for wheelchair accessibility, wheelchair accessible merry-go-round, tandem swings, and stimulation components such as wind chimes and sensory panels, all on a rubber, impact-absorbent playground base surface. The entire park is handicap accessible.

The six fenced-in courts have windscreen fabric on the north and south ends, a divider fence separating the north courts from the south courts, and LED lighting. It also has a children's playground, a lighted softball field, a boat landing on the Wisconsin River, picnic areas, volleyball courts, a sheltered picnic area with water and electricity, tennis courts, and restroom facilities.



Prairie River

The Prairie River, which flows through Merrill and extends through much of Lincoln County and into the Gleason area, is a Class-A trout stream. The Gleason community is the self-proclaimed trout capital of the world after a fisherman caught a record-breaking 9 lb. 15 oz. brook trout on the Prairie in 1944.



Prairie River Dells Scenic Area

Approximately 6.5 miles north of Merrill or 4.5 miles south of Gleason off Hwy 17 on Prairie Dells Rd

The parking lot for the Prairie Dells Viewing Area is small and unassuming - just a gravel turnaround at the end of the road. Two trails lead from there. The trail heading upriver leads to a small deck, one of two built in 2006, with a river vista, and then a primitive trail leads down the rocks and along the river. It's worth exploring for the sure-footed, but the plant growth is heavy.

The trail heading downriver provides stunning views of the river and steep rock formations. Further down the trail, another massive mound of rock on the right provides more spectacular views. Be on the lookout for wildlife in the area, as well. Natural trails twist



through and around rock ledges and outcroppings and lead to the water's edge. While not maintained trails, they provide some great scenery for adventurous hikers or fishermen headed to the river's edge.

The Prairie River, a tributary of the Wisconsin River, is about 40 miles long and flows freely its entire length, and is well known as one of the largest and most productive trout streams in the area.

Prairie Trails Park N2121 Cty Rd K . Merrill

A 99-acre area of pristine and natural parkland designed for low-impact silent recreation, wildlife observation, and promoting physical wellness. The park extends along a two-mile stretch of the Prairie River, which is a Class "A" Trout stream. Amenities include: 2.5 miles of hiking, walking, biking, cross country skiing and snowshoeing trails, boardwalk, bridge, outdoor education pavilion, two canoe landings, a scenic overlook, and a handicap accessible fishing pier.



River Bend Trail Park Trailhead, south end of Park St Merrill

For walking, running, snowshoeing, cross country skiing, and biking, with room for strollers, pets, and wheelchairs, the River Bend Trail Park is a linear park with five miles of paved multi-purpose trail that

runs from Culvers Restaurant* on Merrill's east side to Council Grounds State Park north of Merrill, and is still in the process of being extended. More than two miles of the trail run along the Wisconsin River. Enjoy pristine natural beauty while hiking or biking on a marked route along city streets and sidewalks that connect the River Bend Trail* to the Merrill Area Recreation Complex and Council Grounds State Park. Much of the trail is well lit. At the trailhead on Park St, the Agra Pavilion offers inside and outside public space, restrooms, and covered shelter wings on all sides. The Agra Pavilion is available for rental for events. A new handicap accessible fishing pier is located near the trailhead, as well, and the River Bend Trail is all handicap accessible.

Along the trail to the east, Tyler's Playground provides a place to sit peacefully in nature and where children can experience creative play in a natural environment. The grand cupola from the T.B. Scott Mansion that once existed on the hillside across the river was restored and also stands at the trailhead on Park St, along with a historical marker telling of its history.

A 6-acre park with a fantastic view of the historic three-arch bridge on East First St. It has a kitchen shelter with electricity and water and is available for rental. The park also has a playground, a sand volleyball court, access to the Prairie River, and restroom facilities.









Stange's Park

A reservable building featuring a kitchen area, shelter, and restrooms all under one roof was constructed in 2018. The 11.6-acre park along the Prairie River also received new paving on the parking lot and a lighted basketball court. Other amenities include playground equipment, an open-sided picnic shelter, and scenic walking bridges. The park is located at the corner of Third St and Parkway Dr, adjacent to the historic T.B. Scott Library property.

Camping with horses is permitted here. Marked trails provide opportunities for hiking, biking, showshoeing, cross-country skiing, and horseback riding.

12 mountain bike trail segments totaling about 20 miles. Some sections of trail are very challenging and geared toward expert riders. Portions of the trail are used for the annual Thunderdown in the Underdown endurance mountain bike race. The signed horse trails are available for the beginning bike rider or for family outings. Please yield the right of way to horses when meeting on the horse trail.

There are approximately 33 km of marked cross country ski trails, which pass through over 4,600 acres of Lincoln County Forest Land. The trail network is made up of a 20 km, a 12 km, and a 5 km loop. These loops are individually marked with a separate color to make them easy to follow. There are directional maps at each major intersection.

Love fishing and the great outdoors? Two words: Merrill, Wisconsin

Chris Kalafice is a third-generation fishing enthusiast who has spent his life "fishing on rivers, streams, and lakes all over Wisconsin and abroad." After all of those experiences, his favorite fishing spots and experiences are still rooted right here in Merrill and the surrounding area.

From muskies—the "fish of all fish"—to walleye, small mouth bass (a/k/a smallies), pan fish like bluegill, crappies, and perch, and brookies, browns, and rainbow trout, this area has them all—and he's caught them all.

He's passing on what he learned from his dad and grandpa to his son and daughter, and they've been bitten by the fishing bug, too. Fishing, hiking, camping, spending time in nature in this area, and just enjoying the beauty of the great outdoors making memories with his wife and kids. Kalafice is enthusiastic about everything this area has to offer, introducing youth to fishing, and inviting visitors to come and experience it for themselves.

Feel the exhilarating challenge of wrestling a big musky in, taking a photo with the ages-old fish, and releasing it back into the river to be caught by another. Wade area rivers in the shallows and catch panfish one after another. Cook up a freshly caught trout on a grill or open pit fire, or wrap the northern fillets you just caught in bacon with an olive oil and butter baste and lemon pepper seasoning. Umm!

Ojibwe Territory

Long before the community now known as Merrill existed, the area now occupied by our city was native forested land. It was a beautiful wilderness of open skies, towering trees, and gentle hills, with the Wisconsin River and Prairie Rivers flowing through it. Native Chippewa tribes, more correctly known as the Ojibwe, Ojibwa, Ojibway, or Anishnaabe people, traveled through and lived in the area.

A semi-nomadic people, they hunted, fished, and trapped, made maple sugar and syrup, harvested wild rice, and grew corn and squash where possible. They

traveled by foot or by nearby waterways, including the Wisconsin and Prairie Rivers, in birch bark canoes.

They lived in wigwams and made their own snowshoes. During winter months, they fished through the ice.

Bands of this Algonquian-speaking North American Indian tribe occupied most of Wisconsin, along with

Indian tribe occupied most of Wisconsin, along with Minnesota, Michigan, North Dakota, and parts of southern Canada.

Their earliest contact with white men is said to have been with French trappers and missionaries.



Father Menard

René Ménard, who was born in Paris, France, on March 2, 1605, was one such missionary. He became a Jesuit on Sept. 7, 1624, and arrived in Quebec, Canada, in early May, 1640. He traveled as a French Jesuit missionary explorer, along with fur traders and trading parties from native American tribes. In the course of his life, he worked among many native tribes and communities and learned many native American languages.

In 1660, at the age of 55, Father Menard was commissioned to establish a mission among the Ottawa in what is now northern Wisconsin. He and his party of Ottawa and fur traders endured great hardships paddling continuously as they traveled by water, carrying heavy loads and existing on small rations. Nonetheless, Menard persisted and is said to have baptized and taught the Christian faith to many.

In the spring of 1661, the story goes that he heard a band of Hurons was starving and he embarked on a mission to come and help them, though he himself had only some dried meat and a bag of sturgeon. He traveled with a fur trader and walked and canoed down into what is believed to be present-day Taylor County. Then, at a rapids, about a day's

journey from his destination, he became separated from his companion and disappeared.

A granite monument in honor of Father René Menard, located north of Merrill on Hwy. 107,

indicates he disappeared while portaging around Bill Cross Rapids in the nearby Wisconsin River.

Catholic historical records say Menard's cassock and breviary were later found among the Dakotas, and a sign in Iron County, Michigan, near the Michigamme River, claims Father Menard died there on July 4, 1661.

It is likely Father Menard was one of the earliest white men to have traveled through or near the community now known as Merrill.



Lumber scouts

As America began expanding settlements further west, fur traders and lumber scouts ventured into previously unexplored territory.

Before Merrill was settled, it was forest. Virgin timber, ripe for the logging industry, covered the countryside.

Most Merrill residents know that prior to being Merrill, the community was known as the town or village of Jenny, and some even know it was referred to as Jenny Bull Falls, but most don't know that even prior to that, the area was known as Beaulieux Rapids, named after an early French trader, whose last name was known by various spellings [depending on the source] including the Americanized spelling of Bollier.

Various historical accounts dispute the date of that French trader's arrival, with one source citing 1831 or 1832, while another claims he arrived in 1818 and built a log cabin about a mile below what became the site of Jenny.

The area was also settled by John Hogan, who filed under a squatter's claim in 1843. Logging scouts came to the area and established a logging camp near what is now the foot of Center Avenue in Merrill.

Warren builds a dam

Articles in various newspapers indicate Hogan's claim was sold to Andrew Warren in 1846, who constructed a 500-foot-long and 9-foot-high dam across the Wisconsin River in 1847, and then constructed the area's first sawmill at what is now the foot of Mill Street, establishing a permanent community here. Thus, 1847 is heralded as the beginning of the settlement that would come to be known as Merrill, Wisconsin.

Warren's sawmill, powered by the dam, drew other logging-based enterprises to the area, along with businesses to support the needs of area logging camps. Warren constructed basic housing for his crew, and the community grew. More settlers, more sawmills, more building. Workers and families followed. Services and retail emerged to support the community. Logging was the industry of the time, and this area had the resources to fuel the industry and the growth of a new community.



A town called Jenny

The small fledgling community was initially called Jenny Bull, or Jenny Bull Falls, consistent with the names of many communities along the Wisconsin River that ended with "Bull Falls." In 1851, the Town of Jenny was officially formed, but a state map of Wisconsin from 1853 shows the name as "Virginia," and not "Jenny."

A story about an Indian princess named Jenny surfaced years later, suggesting that she was the origin of the town's name, but that story has been dismissed as quaint folklore, and some accounts say a newspaper reporter from Milwaukee concocted the story in 1892. There is other speculation about the source of the name, but there are no facts to determine the true origin of the name Jenny for the town.

Residents organized and voted to build a school. It was built behind what is now Kindhearted Home Care* in Merrill's downtown area.

In 1874, Lincoln County was created and Jenny became the County seat.

According to the City of Merrill* website, "The population of Lincoln County in 1875 was 895, with Lincoln County extending north to the Michigan border. In 1880, the population of Lincoln County had increased to 2,011, with 822 being residents of present day Merrill."



From just a few people and families in 1855, the community grew steadily, increasing after a permanent bridge was constructed across the Wisconsin River in 1871, and then grew drastically once the railroad reached the area in 1879.

T.B. Scott bought into Warren's original sawmill, and ultimately purchased it so that by 1880 it was owned entirely by T.B. Scott and became known as the T.B. Scott Lumber Co.

Becomes the City of Merrill

In 1881, the Village Board passed a Resolution to rename the town Merrill, after Sherburn Sanborn Merrill, who was the General Manager of the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway Co. The original plat survey of the corresponding area took place.

Also in 1881, the Wisconsin Telephone company began operation with 20 phones in service.

In 1883, the City of Merrill* was incorporated, and T.B. Scott was named as the City's first Mayor.

"In 1885, Lincoln County was divided and the northern portion became Oneida County.

Between 1880 and 1885 the population of Lincoln County more than doubled, as did the population of Merrill. By 1885 the population had risen to 7,000, approximately three thousand less than Merrill's population today," the City of Merrill* website said.

New businesses and industries emerge

Around 1900, with the timber industry in decline, new industries and businesses began to emerge in Merrill. Many of those were byproducts of the lumber industry, utilizing the rich lumber resources nearby. New companies emerged to make windows and doors, and many of those companies are still in business today.

Over the years new businesses began in completely new industries-from insurance to manufacturers of metal parts and products to a shoe factory-many of which have deep roots in the Merrill community and have been active employers of residents for many years.

The railroad accommodated transportation of passengers between cities.



Then in 1889, the Merrill Railway & Lighting Co. was set up in Merrill, providing public transportation within the City limits. Merrill was one of the first cities in Wisconsin to start an electric trolley service.

In 1913, a trackless trolley was added, extending service to the Sixth Ward, to bring riders to the main trolley line.

Every 10 minutes, 16 hours a day, the trolley made a trip to transport residents. In 1915, Wisconsin Valley Electric purchased the company.

In 1921, electric trolleys were replaced with motorized buses, and in 1975, Merrill adopted a full service transit system and dubbed it the Merrill-Go-Round*, which still operates today. The system operates on-demand, with curb-to-curb service, similar to a taxi service, which is unique and not a service offered by most city bus services, and a huge benefit to Merrill's citizens.

The railroad and passenger depot, once "a hub of social activity through the lumber industry's boom years and after" became a community youth center and was later dismantled to accommodate business growth in the community.



The Merrill community is rich in history, and many of the historical buildings and sites in our community are easily accessible by foot. Why not take a walking tour within the city limits and then take a short drive out to the Father Menard Monument afterward? All of the sites within the Merrill City limits that are open to the public and are handicap accessible and others can be viewed and appreciated from handicap-accessible walkways and sidewalks.

Center Avenue Historic District

300-600 Block of North Center Avenue 1200-1300 Block of East Sixth Street, Merrill WI 54452



The historic district covers approximately 21/2 blocks and is comprised of various styles of homes, which span the years of 1885 to 1930. Some of Merrill's wealthiest people built their homes in these few blocks. Eight of the nineteen homes are over 100 years old, and research is still being done on their original construction.

Lincoln County Courthouse

The Lincoln County Courthouse, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places, celebrated its 100th anniversary in the fall of 2003. The courthouse has been restored to reinstate the original, magnificent architecture of the building. Each Christmas season, the courthouse hosts a brilliant light display. Tours are



available. Lobby area open to the public during business hours.

Father Menard Monument

Highway 107 • Merrill WI 54452 (5 miles north of Merrill)

This monument was erected by the Merrill Council 1133 of the Knights of Columbus in 1923 in honor of Pere Rene Menard, a French priest who was one of the first Europeans to walk and explore the wild land that has become Wisconsin. His final trek is still somewhat of a mystery, but some Merrill historians believe Father Menard's life ended just north of Merrill. The monument states what is believed to be his last journey. "Sailed to Quebec in March 1640, lost hearabouts July 1661, while enroute to Huron Village to baptize Indian refugees."





Merrill Post Office

430 East Second Street Merrill WI 54452 • 715-536-2800

This historic post office was built in 1915 and is the second oldest post office in Wisconsin placed on the National Register of Historic Places. The post office has been updated to become handicap accessible yet still features a lobby restored to its original design. Lobby area open to the public during business hours.

The Society Research Library maintains an extensive collection of documents, photographs, and artifacts relating to local and regional history. These resources are frequently used by people who are doing genealogical research, studying the history of their home or business, or learning about the heritage of our community. Research Library hours are by

appointment.

Programs are held at the Heritage Center, an 80-year-old church building owned by the Society, and include a History Hunt and Trivia Quiz and other programs.

A new museum addition opened in 2013 to consolidate exhibit, library, and office spaces in a handicapped-accessible environment that is critical to the effective utilization of all of the Society's resources.

The Society's vision is to help the community of the Merrill area engage the past in new and exciting ways; foster partnerships and mutual growth and learning; and widen the circle of those who love history.

Old City Hall

Built in 1889, the former City Hall building also had several rooms devoted to the T.B. Scott Library from 1891 to 1911. The City Hall offices were located in this building until December of 1977. The structure was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1978. Today it has been renovated into privately-owned loft apartments.




Three-Arch Stone Bridge
East First Street • Merrill WI 54452

On the National Register of Historic Places, this bridge, built in 1904, is the only three-arch bridge left in Wisconsin used for public travel. It is 130 feet long and each arch features a decorative pattern of stones.



T.B. Scott Library 106 West First Street Merrill WI 54452 • 715-536-7191

Named for the City's first Mayor and one of its founders, the T.B. Scott Library was built in 1911. This historic building has undergone many changes over the years, with the largest expansion and renovation completed in 2001. The library has received many fine recognitions, including two "Wisconsin Library of the Year" awards, and is listed in the National Historic Register. A wide variety of programs for all ages are offered year round by the library. Open to the public during normal operating hours.



Honorary Historic Street Signs

Various locations within the City of Merrill In 2023, the City of Merrill's Historic Preservation Committee began accepting nominations for the names of former Merrill citizens who had made significant historical contributions and deserved special recognition. They began honoring those citizens by erecting honorary street signs near locations that were significant to those individuals in their lifetimes. The signs tell a bit about the person and their contribution and invite those who see the signs to explore further to learn more about that individual and their contribution to the Merrill community and the greater world. This is part of an ongoing project.



This quiet place pays tribute to the Merrill and Lincoln County citizens who served our country and memorializes all those in our County who lost their lives in wartime. Benches invite visitors to sit a while and remember, to ponder those who gave their lives to protect our American freedoms, and to honor their commitment and sacrifice. An historic 7-inch Mortar Model 1892 cannon weighing 1,715 pounds and measuring 4.86 feet long is also located at the memorial, a gift to the City of Merrill as the County seat of Lincoln County, secured by A.P. Nelson from the war department in 1920.

A short jaunt across town to Merrill's west side leads to another discovery: Iron Angel Arts & Antiques* at 1106 West Main Street. They are known for their repurposed handcut metal art, but they also have antiques and vintage items. The store has works from local artists and herbal remedy options, as well. You are sure to find a unique gift you won't find anywhere else in town.

Take a drive through the rural countryside east of Merrill to discover School House Unique*, an historic one-room school house



moved to private property on an area farm where it was converted to a gift shop, featuring antiques and the work of many local artisans. Located at N721 Range Line Road, Merrill, in the Town of Pine River, getting there incorporates a relaxing drive past family farms, evergreen plantations, and grazing horses. The inventory is constantly changing, so every visit is an opportunity to discover new treasures-from antique housewares to handmade jewelry and homemade soaps; handmade cards to candles and exquisitely-detailed, locally-made wood carvings. It's worth the drive!

Across town inside the Merrill Enrichment Center*, 303 North Sales Street, the MEC Craft Shop showcases a wide array of goods made and handcrafted by local artisans. From local maple syrup and honey to seasonal and year-round decor, clothing items, and gifts, you're certain to find something you just have to have. Quilts, adorable crocheted toys, afghans, mugs, woodcrafts, jewelry, aprons and kitchen accessories, hats, sweatshirts, yard art, birdhouses, greeting cards, art prints, baby items, and so much more fill this small shop. Take your time and discover the treasures created by talented locals.



Continue on your journey to the Old Time General Store & Mercantile*, N5342 Hwy. 17 in Gleason. New merchandise is mixed in with timeless treasures, vintage finds, and gently used items. The store also features live bait, tackle, fireworks, liquor, sporting goods, hardware, furniture, some groceries and snacks, and locally handmade items and is the perfect place to spend time in search of that special "something" or just to pick up the extras you need when you're in the area recreating.

WINERIES & BREWERIES

Like microbrews? On Merrill's south side, the Sawmill Brewing Company*, 1110 South Center Avenue, offers their own uniquely brewed beers in a former Department of Natural Resources Ranger Station-turned Brewery and Bar. Set among towering pines, the inside was transformed using reclaimed materials from former factories and other properties in the area to create unique custom furnishings, stairs, and flooring rich with character and charm. The bar was created from a tree that came down in the tornado that hit Merrill in 2011. The result of an extensive two-year project is a unique, warm, rustic, friendly atmosphere where friends and visitors gather on two floors to enjoy original beers and blends brewed right on site with locally-sourced ingredients to create unique flavors.

The property includes an outdoor tent (seasonally) where local bands often provide live music, a fire pit and loads of seating outdoors, and even play equipment for the kids. A family friendly venue, beer flavors like Boom Decker Becker (named after a local legend-order up a glass and ask to hear the story) and other unique brews named after the community's logging past, are served up during fun events like music bingo, food truck nights, open mic nights, live music, trivia nights, and even fly-tying nights.



Absent a food truck/event, the Sawmill offers Stoney Acres pizzas (made locally with organic ingredients at Stoney Acres Farm in rural Athens) and charcuterie boards.

The community comes together for food, fun, and beer at the Sawmill Brewing Company. Open to the public and with some spaces available by reservation for private gatherings, the Sawmill Brewing Company has been a staple in the Merrill community since 2016.



For those who prefer wine, Sunset Hollow Ranch* W3193 Pine River Road now has a downtown Merrill location. Sunset Hollow Wine Bistro & Gifts* at 811 East First Street in Merrill offers a selection of their handcrafted wines, available by the glass, the bottle, or the case, in a charming setting that combines historic tin ceilings with rustic wood, modern furnishings, a live edge handcrafted wood bar, and the perfect mix of decor, most of which is locally handcrafted and available for purchase. A selection of sandwiches from the grill and delicious desserts make it the perfect place for a late ladies lunch, an after-work gathering, date night, or just because. Outdoor seating in back is also available seasonally.

Sunset Hollow Ranch Wine Barn is still available for private gatherings and special events. Tucked away on a dead-end road, the Ranch also features an outdoor patio area, campfire space for gatherings, animal barns, and lawn spaces for other events.

Just a relaxing 15-minute scenic drive from Merrill, Sunset Hollow is both a winery, featuring handcrafted house and award-winning specialty wines, and a working farm where the Hoffman family raises organic pork and chicken which hey also sell.

All of Sunset Hollow's events are kid-friendly, and children are always welcome.

With the opening of the Sunset Hollow



Wine Bistro & Gifts location right in Merrill, events like their "Old Fashioned Christmas" horse-drawn wagon or sleigh rides ... accompanied by the sound of sleighbells, the neighing of horses, the gentle sounds of nature, and the laughter of companions on rides along the river and through the woods ... will be less frequent. Likewise, their bonfire and stone-fired pizza events a bit more sporadic.

Their popular "Unwind with Goat Yoga and Wine" will continue in the summer months.

Sunset Hollow house wines-white, blush, and red wines, many sweet, some dry, and a few, like the Blackberry, considered semi-sweet wine, are available year round. But Sunset Hollow Ranch is best known for their specialty wines and unique wine blends with added liqueurs, which rotate with the seasons. For example, their first specialty wine, which combined Blackberry wine with brandy, is now a Christmas specialty wine. The winery also makes two dessert wines year-round: Chocolate Raspberry Bliss, a very heavy port dessert wine, and Chocolate Strawberry Indulgence, recalling the indulgences of chocolate-covered strawberries.

A wine tasting typically involves a flight of four different kinds of wine, but guests can also purchase wine by the glass or the bottle and can stock up on their seasonal favorites to take home or use as gifts.

While produced at the Ranch in Pine River, the winery itself is not open to the public.

Sunset Hollow Wine Bistro & Gifts is a welcome addition to the Merrill downtown.

This full-service, Fixed Base Operator (FBO) facility is located on Merrill's northwest side, conveniently located near the Merrill Industrial Park. The City-owned public-use airport is located one nautical mile northwest of the central business district of Merrill. There are two asphalt-surfaced lighted runways; one is 3,000 feet in length and the newest one is 5,100 feet long. The airport offers aircraft rental, maintenance, and 100LL and Jet-A fuel, which is available 24 hours a day.

Merrill's new airport terminal accessed via Champagne Street has available hangar building spaces on the west side of the airport. Though a small-town airport, we have a certified full-time mechanic on staff. Rare for a small-town, this is a huge benefit for our community. [CWA has the next nearest one.]. On display at the airport is a F84F Thunder Streak plane. This plane was used in the Korean War as a fighter-bomber and was the first in its series to have the capability of super sonic speeds when it is in a slight dive.

Merrill's transit system, known as the Merrill-Go-Round, is the only one in the state of Wisconsin – and one of the few in the nation – that will literally pick you up and drop you off at your doorstep. There's no need to wait at a bus stop here!

The Merrill-Go-Round provides public transportation within the growing 12-square-

miles of City limits, caring for the residents of the Merrill community.

Service hours are 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. To reserve your ride, call 715-536-7112 one hour before you wish to ride.

The cost to ride is only \$2 per person. (Reduced rates for the elderly and disabled who register with the Transit Office to receive a reduced fare card.) Persons riding for the purpose of assisting the disabled ride free. Children under age 6, accompanied by an adult, ride free.

ATV/UTV Trails

The City of Merrill and surrounding areas are ATV/UTV friendly (although they may not be driven on Highways 64 or 107 including the sections that run through the city limits). There are also many ATV and UTV trails available in the Merrill area.
