Let's start with some obvious things that many people are MOSTLY aware of. The Stevens Point Brewery is home of the Stevens Point Special beer; however, did you know that they produce 150 different products from soda to seltzer to of course beer. Staying on the beverage side we have Sunset Point Winery and my personal favorite the wine pouches that contain exactly one glass of wine. Some of the grapes are even locally grown and juiced.

We have Del Monte Foods Inc. in Plover that packages green beans grown right here in Portage County along with potatoes, carrots and beets.

Then we have Fall Line Outfitters Co., on the square in downtown Stevens Point, that manufacture their own line of Buffalo Gloves under the brand name of BrFur. These gloves are warm and durable made from genuine bison leather shell and insulated for whatever outdoor tasks you have.

Another specialized product manufacturing company is Gamber-Johnson, LLC. They make cradles and docking stations as well as vehicle mounts for police/vehicle equipment, material handling equipment, semi-trucks as well as desk top mounts, cart mounts and wall mounting systems for all your mounting space needs.

Ki Mobility, a company founded by two gentlemen in 2005 that produce assistive technology - custom wheel chairs. These are custom fit, durable systems that adjust to each user to form a complex item that fits each person just right.

Steel King Industries is another manufacturer that is the nation's only single-source manufacturer of pallet racks, drive in rack, flow rack, pushback rack, pick modules, mezzanines, cantilever racks, portable racks, industrial containers, custom shipping racks, and industrial safety guard railing.

Let's look at the technology sector with Skyward and their Student Information Systems and Municipality Enterprise Resource Planning. Over 2,500 school districts and municipalities entrust their data to Skyward because their experience is manifested in their solutions.

Then we have our many Potato Producers growing and packaging under several brand names for retail sales in the store as well as growing potatoes to make my favorite – Frito-Lay potato chips, my kryptonite.

Adults spend more waking time at work each week than with their families. When a workplace is functioning well, it becomes a place of belonging and purpose (these are qualities of well-being that can sustain us when life becomes unmanageable).

Prevent Suicide Portage County hopes to inspire workplaces to prevent suicide by incorporating a suicide prevention strategy as part of their health and safety priorities. The goal of the National Guidelines for Workplace Suicide Prevention (workplacesuicideprevention.com) is to change the culture of workplaces.

<u>Practices for Making Suicide a Health and Safety</u> <u>Priority at Work:</u>

- 1. <u>Leadership</u> Cultivate a caring culture focused on community well-being by offering volunteering opportunities and staff appreciation.
- 2. Job Strain Reduction Assess and address job strain and toxic work contributors provide access to coping resources.
- 3. <u>Communication</u> Increase awareness of understanding suicide and reduce fear of suicidal people through employee assistance plans.
- 4. Self-Care Orientation Introduce self-screening and stress/crisis inoculation planning.
- 5. <u>Training</u> Build a satisfied suicide prevention response program specialized training by role.
- 6. Peer Support & Well-Being Train ambassadors in both informal and formal initiatives.
- Mental Health & Crisis Resources Evaluate and promote current employer resources and usage.
- 8. <u>Mitigating Risk</u> Reduce access to lethal means and address legal issues by providing information and resources.
- 9. <u>Crisis Response</u> Provide accommodation, reintegration and postvention strategies.
