

Price County Tourism Posts Record-Breaking Year in 2022

The numbers are in, and Travel Wisconsin has released 2022's economic impact data. Throughout the state, the tourism industry generated a record-breaking \$23.7 billion; here in Price County, we also had a record-breaking year, with \$36 million in economic impact. The previous Price County record was \$35 million in 2019. Additionally, last year, Price County tourism supported 281 part-time and full-time jobs across various sectors of the industry and generated \$2.2 million in tax revenue. Statewide, tourism generated \$1.5 billion in state and local tax revenue. Without this revenue, each Wisconsin household would pay an additional \$620 to maintain the current level of government services.

"We were so pleased to get the news about this record-breaking year in Price County tourism and to see the numbers for economic impact here in Price County. We know that our year-round recreational opportunities are some of the best, and it's great to see the positive impact tourism has on our local economy," remarked Laura Palzkill, PACC Executive Director.

In 2022, there were 111.1 million visits in Wisconsin, which was up 8.8 million visits, or 8.7%, over the previous year. This includes a record 45.4 million overnight visits, or a 13.8% increase from 2021. Overnight visitors, on average, spent nearly three times as much as day trip visitors.
