



Estate Planning: Basic Financial Housekeeping

One of the most important components of a sound financial strategy is also one of the most overlooked. Estate planning is vital to ensure that assets are transferred from one person to another as intended while avoiding unnecessary tax burdens, issues with probate courts, and other complications.



Major life events that can affect the transfer of wealth include divorce, death, disability, illness, and long-term care. Some people avoid estate planning because it often requires having difficult conversations about these topics. But the reassurance that comes with comprehensive planning is well worth a potentially uncomfortable discussion. Proper planning around the transfer of wealth with specific goals and objectives can make life changes much easier. Having a solid strategy in place during a stressful time in life can help alleviate some of that stress.

Having "The Talk"

A good starting point is to ask some simple questions. "If something were to happen to me, are my accounts set up to transfer to my spouse or other beneficiaries or heirs?" "What portion of my assets will go to the IRS as opposed to my children or spouse?" An experienced financial advisor can help take some of the anxiety out of the discussion.

Over the past several years, estate planning and wealth transfer conversations have begun to center around taxes for many people. IRS directives concerning inherited IRAs have changed over the last two years. Beneficiaries who inherit an IRA with pre-tax money now have 10 years to completely deplete the account to zero. For those who are still earning income, this distribution could put them into a much higher tax bracket. Gifting a certain amount of money each year instead can be a very effective tax-free alternative. Similarly, owners of an IRA can transfer some of the value to themselves, thus paying a lower tax rate than their beneficiaries would.

Be Prepared for Changes

An experienced financial advisor knows how to monitor the overall tax policy landscape and anticipate when new laws will take effect. For instance, if a new tax policy is likely to be instated in the next year or two that carries increased liabilities, it might be prudent to receive distributions now to avoid paying higher taxes later. Transversely, if a tax decrease is likely, it might be a good idea to postpone distributions to take advantage of the lower rate. Depending on policy, the tax liability can be as low as 15% or as high as nearly 40%.

A Time to Act

Estate planning is an important part of any financial strategy. Talking with a licensed professional about your estate planning and other financial needs can help resolve misconceptions you may have and bring you reassurance. And while it's never too early to start planning, it is sometimes too late.

Power Tool Safety

#ToolHazards

Tools are common in many workplace settings and power tools are especially important to get the job done, however it is important to remember that electrical tools can pose significant hazards. Workers should be sure that they are familiar with the specific hazards of the tools they use including hazards such as:

- Electrical shock
- Cuts & amputations
- Eye injuries
- Amputations
- Trip & Fall Hazards
- Puncture Wounds



Injuries with tools often happen when workers fail to use them as intended, remove guards designed for their own safety, or forget to inspect them before using.

Workers should be trained on the safe handling and care of the power tools they will be using on the job and be reminded regularly to follow safe work practices every time they use their tools.

Always inspect your electrical tools and extension cords before use.

- Inspect tools for any damage such as cut or frayed cords, cracks, or signs of electrical damage.
- Ensure that tools are not covered in paint, grease, or dirt that can create a hazard or hide a serious defect.
