The "Goal"

- Have a close interactive relationship with your key Legislators.
- The Legislator must feel like you are invested in the success of the Legislator and not just using the relationship to accomplish your own goals.
- Developing a friendship is the ultimate measure of success.



The "Relationship"

- Definition:
 - -The relationship between two people or groups is the way in which they feel and behave toward each other.
- Develop a relationship based on more than just the "Ask"
- Dedicate regular time and attention to the relationship



Meeting with Members and Staff

- Give Personal History
 - -Who, What, Where, Why
 - –Community ties
- Ask About Legislator's Personal History
- Provide ESD "work" background
 - -key facts about your ESD and your role
- Discuss ESD "talking points" for the Day
- ASK what you can do for Legislator
- PROVIDE personal contact information and ...
- COMMIT to follow up with Legislator



Talking Points

- I. ESDs are the BEST method to provide fire and EMS services in Texas, serving approximately 10 Million Texans.
 - Two economic studies by The Perryman Group support this
- 2. ESDs need protection from cities trying to annex areas or withdraw from an ESD unilaterally and without a vote of the people.
- 3. ESDs need authority to determine exactly how emergency services are provided within their voter approved boundaries.
- 4. ESDs need revenue protection from cities trying to defund emergency services by taking sales tax and property tax for city projects and developer agreements that are unrelated to public safety.



The Perryman Report

CONCLUSIONS:

- "Emergency Services Districts provide a stable source of funds for fire protection and other protective services, cost savings, and economic benefits."
- "These savings generate significant economic benefits of an estimated \$1.2 billion in annual gross product and 12,081 jobs across Texas."
- "Without the resources provided by ESDs, many areas would be faced with inadequate protective services.



TML Attack on ESDs

- allow cities to remove themselves from an ESD if the city is capable of providing services to the area.
- expressly authorize ESDs to expand into a city's limits or ETJ only with city council approval; and
- require an ESD to enter into a sales and use tax sharing agreement with a city when a city annexes territory located in an ESD and, should negotiations fail, enter into binding arbitration and/or mediation.
