






### **Marketing Director Letter**



McDonough County CEO is pleased to introduce their third class of student entrepreneurs, making up the McDonough County CEO Class of 2022.

Throughout the program year, students will visit local businesses, learn from guest speakers, participate in operating a class business, write a business plan, and, from concept to reality, build their own legal, functioning business entity. Students meet for class each weekday from 7:30 to 9 a.m., arriving at a local business or meeting location dressed in business attire, ready to meet community members, and learn life skills. CEO works to foster skills like problem-solving, teamwork, self-motivation, responsibility, critical thinking, communication and curiosity.

Students in the McDonough County CEO program come from schools throughout the county, including Bushnell-Prairie City, Macomb, West Prairie, Trinity Academy, and homeschool. Twelve juniors and seniors were selected for the 2021-22 class

### **Eligibility Guidelines:**

- 1. You have been a resident of McDonough County for at least one year.
- 2. Your household's annual income does not exceed the following guidelines: \$38,640 for a one-person household; \$52,260 for a two-person household; \$65,880 for a three-person household; for each additional household member, add \$13,620.
- 3. You have a high school diploma or GED, or you will graduate by December 31, 2021 from an accredited high school or GED administering institution.
- 4. You are a <u>full-time</u> student at a college/university, community college, or occupational training program.

One traditional student and one non-traditional student will be awarded a scholarship.


