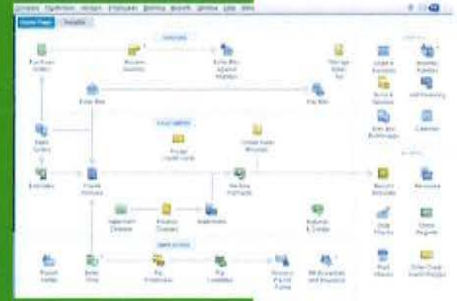

The **Greencastle Antrim Food Pantry** exists to improve the health and wellbeing of those in our community by providing access to food, nutrition and other related resources. Beginning in 1984, this pantry has been serving those in need for forty years! While there have been many changes over the past four decades, having people in the greater Greencastle-Antrim community affected by food insecurity has not. We currently serve an average of 140 families per month.

The Greencastle Antrim Food Pantry operates solely by volunteers. Donations must be checked for current dates and stocked on the shelves. Bags need to be packed for clients and carried to their cars during our hours of operation. We are open the first Thursday of every month from 6 to 8 p.m. and the second and third Wednesdays from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.

The Greencastle Antrim Food Pantry is recognized by the state and therefore has some food provided through South



Central Community Action Program (SCCAP). However, as a non-profit, we rely heavily on food contributions and cash donations to purchase food. Our efforts alone could not sustain this outreach. We have been blessed by various community partners helping us achieve our mission and are continually humbled by the generosity of our community.

Montessori Academy of Chambersburg's Upper Elementary class placed first in the nation in the Fall 2023 National Sumdog Math Competition. Throughout the week of the competition, each student in grades 4-6 answered 1,000 math questions for the competition. The students competed against 551 classes and 9,358 students across the United States. Montessori Academy is also celebrating the individual successes of each individual student in the Upper Elementary class, all of whom placed above 352nd place out of 9,358 participants and four of whom placed in the top 100 students nationally. Montessori Academy of Chambersburg, founded in 1998, is a private, non-profit, non-sectarian institution of learning, serving children from 12 months through grade 8 with individualized instruction, hands-on learning materials, and student empowerment.



F&M Trust recently donated \$15,000 to the Central Fulton School District to cover the cost of two scoreboards for the McConnellsburg High School gymnasium. The LED scoreboards will be used in the fall during volleyball matches and in the winter during boys and girls basketball games. CFSD Athletic Director Kenny Welsh said the scoreboards update and enhance the facilities, allowing students to compete at all levels of interscholastic activities, and provide the community with the latest technology for viewing, either in person or via livestream at mconnellsburghs.bigteams.com.

Allison-Antrim Museum will hold its monthly speaker meetings on March 14 and April 11 in the German Bank Barn beginning at 7 p.m. Todd Dorsett will be the March 14 speaker focusing on the book: "Sylvester Snyder's Waynesboro." It is a collection of nearly three hundred photographs made by mechanical and civil engineer Sylvester S. Snyder between 1937 and 1988. Through these pictures of ordinary citizens engaged in their routine activities, the award-winning amateur photographer chronicled the history of his native Waynesboro. Ben Thomas Jr. will speak on April 11 about the 30 wonderful years that WKSL, 94.3 FM filled the airwaves 24 hours a day. A special "Elvis in the Army" exhibit will be on display in March and a unique Greencastle-Antrim baseball exhibit will be featured in April. For more information, visit www.greencastlemuseum.org.

first time, so first impressions count. With a \$29,500 County of Franklin IMPACT grant, the Franklin County Visitors Bureau engaged Remington Builders & Partners to repair and clean the marble steps and Antietam Iron Works to restore, paint and clean the brass-topped iron handrails. Work was complete by the end of the year, ensuring a better first impression for visitors in 2024.

F&M Trust recently donated \$5,000 to the East Broad Top Foundation to help defray the cost of field trips for school students primarily in Fulton and Huntingdon counties. The donation will cover the cost of tickets for hundreds of elementary and middle school students visiting the historic East Broad Top Railroad in Rockhill Furnace in the spring of 2024. The East Broad Top Railroad was built beginning in 1872 and is the only surviving three-foot gauge common carrier railroad east of the Rocky Mountains. 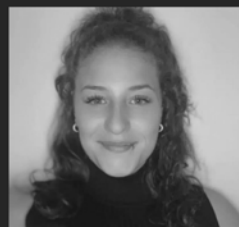

The session focused on criminal justice and local government in Franklin County. The class then traveled to the Franklin County Administrative building to meet with former Chambersburg Borough Council Member Alice Elia, Franklin County Commissioner John Flannery, State Representative Paul Schemel of the Pennsylvania 90th District, Waynesboro School District School Board President Mark Smith and Greencastle Mayor Ben Thomas. The objectives of the day were to motivate and educate participants on topics that impact their community, raise awareness of local government functions and better understand the economic impact of local government decisions for our community.

In February, the class was at **Wilson College** to discuss health care in Franklin County and Understanding Others: Diversity & Inclusion in Leadership. 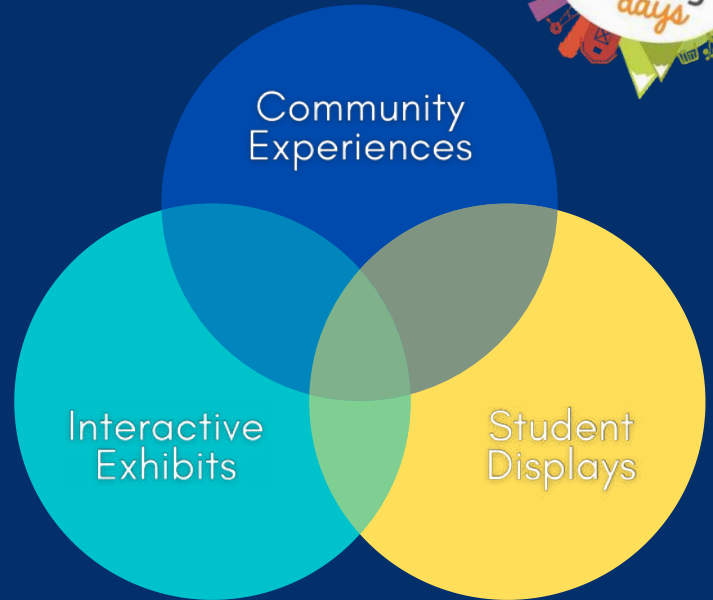
