Two Strikes for the Entertainment Industry

After contract discussions failed, the Screen Actors Guild and American Federation of Radio and Television Artists voted to strike starting today, July 14. This strike is the first for actors since 1980 and the first time two significant Hollywood unions have been on strike at the same time since 1960--as the Writer's Guild of America is also on strike (and has been since May 2, 2023).

According to the Alliance of Motion Picture and Television Producers (AMPTP), studios need actors and actresses for movies and shows, which expressed unhappiness with the strike's result.

During this strike, union actors and writers are prohibited from working on many projects. Industry experts note that production of many films and scripted television show productions in the U.S. may be halted, leading to delays in premieres. Many networks are expected to broadcast reruns. There is no anticipated end date for either strike.
