CFHLA's First-Ever Safety & Security Summit with OCPS



CFHLA is thrilled to share that our first-ever **Safety and Security Summit**, in partnership with <u>Orange County Public Schools</u> was a major success this week. This pilot program for Orange County students showed them firsthand what goes on behind the scenes, while safety and security teams work to protect guests at our Central Florida hotels and resorts.

The CFHLA Public Safety Summit was held Thursday, October 3rd at the <u>Caribe Royale</u> <u>Resort</u> in Orlando. CFHLA extends a special thanks to the resort's Mark Cartotto, Complex Director of Security and Risk Management, and Managing Director Amaury Piedra for graciously hosting the event.

With more than eighty students in attendance, each student had the opportunity to enjoy a behind the scenes tour of the Caribe Royale security office, where security team members monitor hundreds of surveillance cameras to scan for signs of trouble on the property. Future workers had a chance to ask detailed questions about how the cameras help to protect guests and help them receive medical attention if needed.

Additionally, the students learned about several topics including Security

Technology, Emergency Prep/Response/Recovery, Risk management, Deescalation/Customer Service, Situational Awareness, and Roles in the Security & Safety field.

Each of the Security team members explained their jobs are never boring because they are always solving problems and focusing on keeping people safe.

Major Announcement! Orlando chosen to Host 2025 FIFA Club World Cup Matches at Two Downtown Stadiums

The City of Orlando is ready to remind the world once again, why it is a top soccer destination as the City Beautiful gears up to host the matches in the **2025 FIFA Club World Cup**, for the first-time ever.

FIFA announced earlier this week, the 11 cities and 12 venues that were chosen to host matches for the 2025 tournament next year. Both <u>Inter&Co Stadium</u> and <u>Camping</u> <u>World Stadium</u> will welcome the competition during the 32-team tournament next summer. This will also make Orlando the only host city with matches in multiple venues!

This is on top of the 60,016 fans who were drawn to Camping World Stadium earlier this year for the Allstate Continental Clásico, which was a marquee matchup between the U.S. and Brazil Men's National soccer teams. The venue also welcomed a sellout crowd of 63,237 for July's FC Series friendly between European powerhouses Barcelona and Manchester City.

With the **Sports Business Journal** recently naming Orlando the nation's No. 1 city for hosting events, this is just another example of our tourism and hospitality partners working closely toghether to bring even more marquee sports tourism events to Central Florida that improves our economy and our quality of life here. Central Florida Will Host 2028 NCAA Men's Playoff Games and 2027 NCAA Women's Golf Championship



The <u>NCAA</u> has also announced this week, that Orlando was selected to host the Firstand-Second Rounds of the <u>2028 NCAA DI Men's Basketball Championship</u>, as well as the <u>2027 Division II Women's Golf Championship</u>.

The Division I Men's Basketball Championship, also known as March Madness, will return to <u>Kia Center</u> in 2028, co-hosted by <u>UCF</u>. Orlando most recently hosted Firstand-Seconds Round games in 2023, 2017 and 2014, and 2004.

Additionally, the 2027 Division II Women's Golf Championship will be held at <u>Mission</u> <u>Resort + Club</u> in Lake County, co-hosted by <u>Rollins College</u>. With the Championships being played in Lake County, all golf fans will have the ability to watch some of the top women college golfers in America, right in our backyard.

"As the nation's premier sports destination, we're looking forward to welcoming student-athletes and fans from around the country to downtown Orlando for NCAA March Madness," said <u>Orlando</u> Mayor Buddy Dyer. "We can't wait to continue to showcase our vibrant community on the national stage and attract even more visitors to our region."

NCAA championship events attract spectators and families throughout the state of Florida and from across the United States. The collegiate contests have significant impact to hotels, restaurants, and so many small businesses across the Central Florida region.
