Lucky Clover Contest

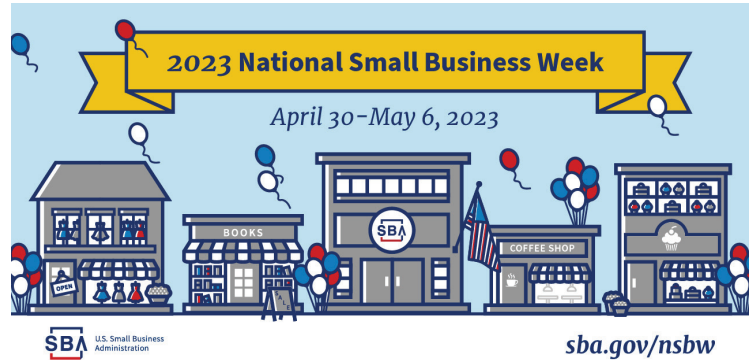

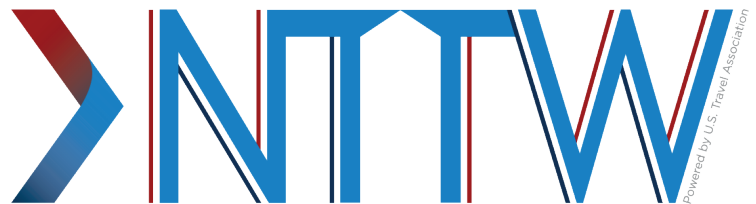
