## "Cross Countries" and Across the Community

In these troubling times a group of students from Oak Lawn Community High School's "Cross Countries" organization decided to help support local Oak Lawn Businesses. They coordinated a relief effort called "Lock Down But Not Out" to benefit Oak Lawn Chamber Businesses and their employees. This student led and heartfelt initiative has kicked off a giving spirit throughout the Oak Lawn Community. Funds have been graciously matched up to \$6,000 by the Oak Lawn Chamber of Commerce.

Four businesses have been selected via a blind lottery to receive up to \$3,000 with the majority being rewarded directly to employees of the selected business. While some businesses are closed, they are not closed out.

This partnership shows the resiliency of the Oak Lawn Community during these difficult times. Your generosity has gone a long way to help heal our community. Winners were selected in a Blind Lottery by the OLCHS Students of the "Cross Countries" organization. The winners were: AB Renovations, Art Clay World USA, Lyla Jewelers and Style 95 Barber Shop.

Cross Countries is a student-led service group established in 2004 at Oak Lawn Community High School. The club has raised over \$225,000 to help fund local and global causes, including hospital construction overseas as well as homelessness and special needs awareness right here in our community.

## **CHICAGO CHATS**

The Oak Lawn Chamber has a new program called Chicago Chats. Below is a description of what the program is about. If you are interested in participating in this program, contact the Chamber office - <u>office@oaklawnchamber.com</u>

We go live on Chicagoland Chats with Facebook Live Monday through Friday during the lunch hour. We plan 12 pm -1 pm in case we have technical glitches. We keep the video around 30 mins. Once the live feed is completed, the link for the video is sharable and can be used inside of Facebook or outside (LinkedIn, etc). Our main objective is to give back to the community at large by spotlighting businesses to share their experiences through COVID and shed light on what they are doing to keep their customers/employees/products safe. The focus currently is around COVID and how businesses are working through it. Eventually we will open it up to more of a spotlight interview. At this point and our plans going forward is not to charge anyone for this. This has allowed us to create a good following in weeks vs. months or years.

A typical video will have over 100 views by the time the live feed is over. Within a few days most of the videos will have 400-800 views. Some of the videos have received more views, over 1000, if we have more people share the content. Each week we have over 3,000 engagements with people on Facebook, and that number keeps growing.

Our relationship with OPCC is one day a week is their day to spotlight a chamber member. In return, we ask the chamber to share our content when they see a new video posted. They have also been there for us when we have a no-show or someone that cancels the last min to find another chamber member to spotlight. This would be the same opportunity for OLCC. We can figure out a day of the week for OL and that's their day going forward. We just kindly ask that your members share the content when they see it.

#### Village of Oak Lawn ReopeningSecond Stage - June 29, 2020

With the State of Illinois moving into Phase 4 on Friday, June 26, 2020, the Village reopening will move to the second stage of our reopening plan effective June 29, 2020.

- All employees and visitors will be required to wear masks when entering any Village owned building and observe social distancing whenever possible.
- Public meetings and social events are limited to the lesser of 50 guests or 50% of overall room capacity.
- Masks are required and social distancing is observed whenever possible. This includes Board of Trustee meetings and all other public meetings.
- All Departments of Village Hall will be open, including the second floor and basement.

#### **U S Small Business Administration**

The assistance, from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is in the form of low-interest loans to help people repair, rebuild and recover. Importantly, these loans are available to homeowners and renters, businesses and nonprofit organizations.

#### **Business Interruption Grants**

Has your business experienced closures due to COVID-19? Apply by July 7th to the Business Interruption Grants (BIG) where \$60M is available for 3,500 businesses. Need assistance with BIG or other small business support or guidance? One of our 42 Illinois Small Business Development Centers (SBDCs) centers are just a call away https://bit.ly/2Uha0XL.

#### **Rebuild Distressed Communities Program**

Have businesses in your community sustained property damage as a result of civil unrest? The \$25 million Rebuild Distressed Communities program will reimburse the costs to repair structural damages, including repairs to storefronts and entrances, improving electrical systems, and restoring exterior work. Organizations interested in applying to

administer Distressed Capital Program grants must apply by July 7th.

#### Additional Relief to Assist Communities with COVID-19 Emergency Response

Governor JB Pritzker recently announced The Local Coronavirus Urgent Remediation

Emergency (Local CURE) Support Program, a plan by his administration to expedite a portion

of Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) dollars designated for local governments by the federal CARES Act.

The State of Illinois will take steps to deploy \$250 million to local governments in the

coming months. The additional state relief funds will help local governments secure

reimbursement on eligible costs associated with the emergency response to the COVID-19 crisis.

The funding will be disbursed by the state to communities seeking reimbursements for emergency costs beginning in July. Learn more.


