### **PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES**

#### **TEACHING**

### **Courses Taught at the University of Pittsburgh:**

CSD 1021 Introduction to Language Development 3 credits UG (SP 17) Typical class size is 75-85 students. Course was co-taught with Dr. Cheryl Messick. The course provides an overview of normal language acquisition from birth into the school-age years.

CSD 1101 Introduction to Clinical Processes 3 credits UG (SP 14, 15, 16)

Typical class size is 75-85 students. Course was co-taught with Dr. Elaine Mormer. The course introduces various aspects of the clinical process including assessment and treatment principles, clinical documentation, data collection, interviewing and counseling, universal precautions, and so on. Emphasis is placed on the development of clinical observation skills.

CSD 1230 Introduction to Speech-language Pathology 3 credits UG (SP 15, 16, 17, 18, 19) Typical class size is 75-85 students. This course provides student with a basic introduction to the field of speech-language pathology. Students are exposed to the diversity of the field through the invited presentations with the first portion of each class session used to review material and make connections between the content across the weeks.

#### CSD 1235 Clinical Methods in CSD

3 credits UG (FA 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21)

Typical class size is 75-85 students. The purpose of this course is to introduce undergraduate students to theoretical knowledge about the evaluation and treatment of human communication disorders. Students develop prerequisite knowledge related to principles of clinical management.

#### CSD 1234 Writing practicum

1 credit UG (FA 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21)

Typical class size is 75-85 students across 2 sections. The purpose of this intensive writing course is to introduce undergraduate students to professional writing skills required of professionals in the field of communication science and disorders.

CSD 2064 Introduction to Clinical Decision-Making 3 credits GRD (FA 18, 19, 20, 21)

Typical class size is 36 students. This course This course prepares students for their first clinical practicum, by orienting them to the principles and procedures underlying assessment, remediation and documentation activities.

CSD 2070 Articulation and Phonological Disorders 3 credits GRD (FA 18)

Typical class size is 36 students. This course introduces the principles and procedures needed to identify, evaluate, and remediate articulation and phonological disorders.

## CSD 2071 Child Language Disorders 1

3 credits GRD (FA 15)

Typical class size is 36 students. This course provides a review of the nature and types of pediatric language disorders including an overview of assessment and intervention techniques for children from birth through preschool.

### CSD 2250 Child Language Disorders 2

3 credits GRD (SP 14, 16-19, 20, 22)

Typical class size is 36-40 students. This course provides a review of the language characteristics and clinical management considerations associated with various special needs populations (including but not limited to intellectual disability), assessment and treatment of oral language disorders in school-age children / adolescents, and assessment and treatment of written language disorders in school-age children / adolescents.
