Intro to Fine Arts Career Academy

The Fine Art Career Academy encompasses many traditional forms of art. ACADEMY COURSES

Fine Art — .5 High School Credit

This course offers beginning art students a chance to work with a variety of mediums. Students will have a chance to work with watercolor, acrylic paint, woodburning, glass etching, clay, and charcoal. This course offers versatility for those that appreciate a variety of tools, mediums, and techniques. This class is focused on becoming a more well-rounded artist, a “Jack-of-all trades”.

3D Art — .5 High School Credit

This course is great for those who like to build things with their hands. The majority of projects made in this class are made from clay. Artwork may be functional or nonfunctional. Students will have opportunities to work on the pottery wheel. Students will also learn the three hand building techniques for ceramics. Other possible mediums used for this course consist of cardboard, wire, and plaster. This is a fun class for those who like to create and build things.

Independent Study Art — .5 High School Credit

This course focuses on building upon the fundamentals of drawing, painting, ceramics, woodburning, glass etching, or printmaking. Students build and maintain a portfolio to turn-in at the end of the semester.

COMPLETION STANDARD

Students wishing to receive a certification for this academy must complete all courses with a grade of ‘B’ or better.

CAREER EXPERIENCES

Students will explore and research careers with industry speakers and attend the Bridges’ Career Exploration Day event and other regional career fairs.
