



Alaska LNG Draft EIS and Public Meetings Comment period ends October 3rd

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) has released a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) on the proposed Alaska LNG Project and has scheduled eight meetings around the state to hear public comments on the document.

The State, which has been directing the estimated \$43 billion project through the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation, plans to finish the work with FERC and look for a path forward with private companies in the lead.

The DEIS found that most project impacts would not be significant and would be reduced to minor impacts with the implementation of proposed avoidance, minimization, and mitigation measures. **Action Requested: AGC of Alaska members** are encouraged to participate in the public comment period by submitting comments in support of the project. <u>Click here to see the RDC Action Alert for additional information including points to consider in your comments.</u>

Ambler Mining District Access Project Comment period ends October 15th

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is developing an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) under the National Environmental Policy Act in accordance with the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act to evaluate whether to grant a right-of-way for the Ambler Road across BLMmanaged lands.

The Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) proposes to construct a new 211-mile -long gravel access road in the southern Brooks Range foothills to provide industrial access to the Ambler Mining District. The road would originate at the Dalton Highway near Prospect Creek and end at the Ambler Mining District and would have no public access. The proposed project crosses state lands (61%) and Native corporation lands (15%), but also crosses federal lands (24%) managed by the BLM and the National Park Service. AIDEA has submitted a permit application to request right-of-way across BLM-managed lands. For more information or to submit a comment, <u>click here.</u>

🖌 Willow Master Development Plan

Comment period ends October 29th

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has released a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the Willow Master Development Plan.

The Willow Master Development Plan will be the first development in the Bear Tooth Unit in the Northeast National Petroleum Reserve-Alaska (NPR-A) on Alaska's North Slope. The Willow Project could be under construction in 2021 with first oil in the 2025-2026 year. Willow will be a stand-alone development capable of producing in excess of 100,000 barrels of oil per day. The project is estimated to cost \$4 billion to \$6 billion.

The benefits to Alaska, from the Willow project, are many. The proposal includes the construction, operation and maintenance of a central processing facility, up to five drill sites, gravel roads, ice roads, ice pads, one airstrip, a nearshore staging area for module transfer, pipelines, and a gravel mine site. Construction activities could span more than seven years at its peak, construction and design activities could employ as many as 2,000 people. The Federal government, State of Alaska and the North Slope Borough will all benefit financially from this project. The state is estimated to collect \$1.7 billion in tax revenue and \$2.5 billion in royalties.

Students are not allowed to use the internet or their coaches to help, instead it is a collaborative effort in a fast-paced, stressful environment to give them real construction management experience.
