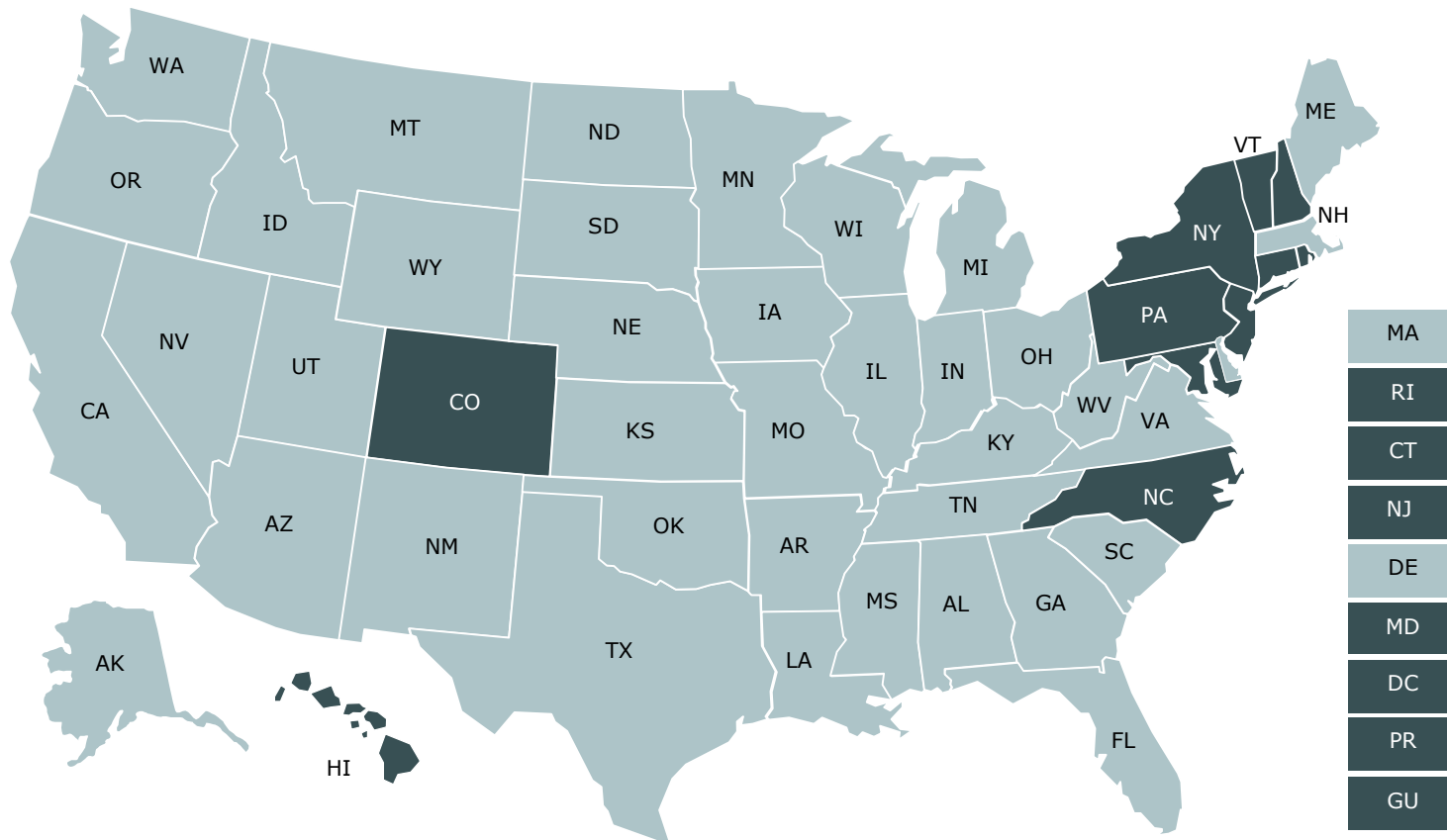

Specific details about mandatory orders in each state

Colorado	Mandatory for essential business employees.
District of Columbia	Mandatory for employees and patrons in retail food sellers, hotels and taxis/rideshares.
Guam	Mandatory for essential business employees and government agency employees and patrons on premises.
Hawaii	Mandatory for essential business employees and patrons while on premises.
New Jersey	Mandatory for essential business employees and patrons while on premises, as well as workers and customers in public transit.
New Hampshire	Mandatory when entering a healthcare facility.
New York	Mandatory in all situations when social distancing is not possible; employers must provide face coverings to essential workers when directly interacting with the public.
North Carolina	Mandatory for employees in nursing homes.
Pennsylvania	Mandatory for essential business employees and patrons while on premises; employers must provide face coverings to essential workers.
Rhode Island	Mandatory for essential business employees and patrons while on premises; employers must provide face coverings to essential workers.
Vermont	Mandatory for essential business employees.
