Through this program, UGA plays a vital role in building the talent of today and empowering them to solve tomorrow's challenges. A signature program within UGA's Innovation District, the SIFP is part of a unique ecosystem of talent, creativity and infrastructure that brings students from a range of disciplines together to solve emergent and pressing challenges through unique, cross-disciplinary courses and experiences.



PRACTICAL TRAINING:

As part of the Student Industry Fellows Program, all Student Fellows must successfully complete a foundational Innovation Catalyst and Design course and be selected as a Fellow. Mentored by a former industry executive, Fellows sharpen and apply skills in the areas of design, market research, business analysis, product development, and project management. Additionally, the program focuses on fostering critical competencies like critical thinking, communication, collaboration, creativity, and professionalism.

Fellows populate multidisciplinary teams that collaborate on real-world projects sourced from partners in industry, government, and community organizations. These design teams provide data-driven research and a unique multidisciplinary insight into the project.
