1.	Post your "We Support Officer" (green sign supplied in packet) in store front window so the officer and community can see your participation as they pass by or enter your business.
2.	Send a Thank You card to your officer Mailing Address: Officer c/o Gresham Police Department, 1333 NW Eastman Parkway, Gresham, 97030
3.	<ul> <li>Sale in officer's honor</li> <li>a. Example: 20% off Sale Honoring Officer or have an Officer Sale Buy one, get one 50% off . Use your retail expertise.</li> <li>b. Take advantage of a discount you were planning to have or create a new one</li> </ul>
4.	Letter to the editor  a. The Gresham Outlook website gets you to Pamplin Media. Click The Outlook. Click letters to the editor. You can upload a message or type new one. Limit 300 words b. Submit a letter written by a school aged family member of yours or your staff.
5.	Coffee card given in officers honor to an individual. Purchase coffee gift card and write on the card "Honoring officer". Give away to family, friends, customers.
6.	<ul> <li>Cops Rock, painting party, hide a rock then find the rock. Paint, hide, find</li> <li>a. The Chamber is dedicating Wednesday, January 26, as a city-wide Cops Rock Day. Encouraging all to paint and hide rocks throughout the Gresham business community.</li> <li>b. Take photo of finding rock and post on social media. Also #AdoptacopGresham. Don't forget to tag the chamber and GPD.</li> <li>c. Finding the rocks and posting photos will continue through Valentine's Day</li> <li>d. Watch for details on chamber website or chamber newsletter</li> </ul>
7.	Digital messaging, thank you to your officer and entire police force. Quick message
8.	Chamber recording  a. Send photos, videos, messages for rebroadcast and posted on Chamber media platforms.  Send to erin@greshamchamber.org
9.	Stickers on paper shopping bags thanking the officer a. Preprint Avery type stickers with a message like: "Thank you Officer"
10	<ul> <li>a. Participate in the Buddy Bear program. Donate new teddy bear (no larger than 12") or a new blanket to The Buddy Bear program. Police officers give bears and blankets to children that are in a traumatic situation (accident, fire, etc.) Program contact: Heidi.Seipert@greshamoregon.gov Buddy Bear in subject line.</li> <li>b. Encourage your customers to join in the donation by having a Buddy Bear donation jar available.</li> </ul>

- 12. Call radio station and thank cop publicly
  - a. Examples: KPAM, WayFM 96.3, KPDQ, KMHD, K103, FISH, etc.
- 13. Post on ALL digital media
  - a. Use #adoptacopgresham
  - b. BLOG
  - c. Website
  - d. Facebook- mention @GreshamAreaChamberOfCommerce @GreshamPolice
  - e. Instagram~ mention @GreshamChamber @GreshamPoliceDept
  - f. Twitter- mention @GreshamChamber @GreshamPD
- 14. Have coloring pages available for kids to color while in your store or business. Tape them to your window or wall. See master copies of coloring pages included in Tool Kit
- 15. Have coloring contest
  - a. In store contest between staff members, customers, neighborhood kids, school classrooms, etc.
- 16. Photo opportunity. Participate in large group photo to be organized by the Chamber of all businesses and officers who participated and can attend. Photo will be scheduled for mid-January. Watch for details. The Chamber will notify you of time and place to participate in group shot.
- 17. Encourage customers to sign a large thank you card that is then sent to the officer
  - a. Use in store
  - b. Deliver during or after Adopt-A-Cop campaign is over to Gresham Police Department at 1333 NW Eastman Parkway, Gresham

- 25. Plant a tree
  - a. Donate a tree to be planted in your officer's name. Non-Profits: One Tree Planted and Friends of Trees have gift giving programs. Cost is one dollar to \$35 in these two
- 26. Go big. Rent a billboard. Gather a group of business friends together and purchase a billboard with a message thanking the Gresham Police department. Longer term thank you commitment.
- 27. Use your business reader board to thank your police officer
- 28. Be a moving billboard. Purchase magnetic signs for your fleet vehicles thanking the Gresham Police and or your officer.
- 29. Donate to the Gresham Police Officers Benevolent Fund
