Back in 2016 the company announced it would move its global headquarters to Chandler from Rogers, Connecticut. Now, they have purchased the former Isola site on the Price Corridor to enhance its work in its Advanced Connectivity Solutions sector.

Rogers Corporation is a global technology leader and this decision to invest in Chandler strengthens our position as the Innovation and Technology Hub of the Southwest. Their continued faith in our community and the region bodes well for future companies looking to locate or expand here.

I recently had Rogers' CEO Bruce Hoechner as a guest on my show to discuss Rogers continued interest in Chandler. Rogers has been part of Chandler for more than 50 years, and it certainly appears they will thrive here for decades to come. While our temperatures are finally starting to drop, the business front continues to stay hot. And that's a good thing for the future of our community.



Ballot Initiatives

Based on the Chandler Chamber of Commerce's *How We Stand* legislative agenda, the Chandler Chamber opposes the voter proposed ballot initiative process for several reasons;

- They take power away from our elected officials, which makes their job much more difficult.
- There are often unintended or unforeseen consequences to these initiatives as many are written in haste and unprofessionally.
- They are generally proposed by very special interests who seek to serve their own causes and don't represent Arizonans as a whole. As well, many of them come from out of state interests.
- They are essentially final and irreversible, due to the fact the legislature must have a 3/4 consensus to change them which is unheard of, particularly in the current extreme partisan environment.
- Due to their finality they do not allow for adaptation or altering which is of paramount importance for conformity to future economic, societal, and political realities.

It is for these 5 very important reasons that we urge you to vote **NO** on:

New ID Rules for Traveling go into Effect, Oct 2020...Be Prepared

Beginning Oct. 1, 2020 Arizona residents will have to comply with a new federal and state law requiring all travelers to obtain a Voluntary Travel ID issued by the Arizona Motor Vehicle Division which complies with the Real ID Act passed by Congress in the wake of September 11th.

The new law creates a more stringent identification process requiring more documentation to obtain a license or Travel ID. If you do not get this new ID, you will not be able to fly out of any Arizona airports, nor will you be able to access any federal buildings or military bases.
