## Meet the Elected Officials

*Jennings Imel speaking at the 2018 Meet the Elected Officials Breakfast*

The Chandler Chamber of Commerce welcomed Jennings Imel, Executive Director for the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, as he presented political and economic reviews of 2017 and of what lies ahead for 2018. Imel detailed a summary review of 2017, as he spoke positively of the U.S. Supreme Court Neil Gorsuch's nomination, the easing of regulatory burden for small businesses, and passing of the Congressional Review Act (CRA). Imel mentioned the contrasting of 2017, of the withdrawal from Transpacific Partnership (TPP), Affordable Care Act (ACA) repeal and replace and reduction of corporate tax rate from 35 % to 21%.

What lies ahead in 2018 are topics including NAFTA, DACA and most importantly a New Budget Deal, along with an infrastructure package which would improve poor conditions of railroads, airports, roads and public works. It was noted bipartisan incentive has decreased on reaching key issue agreements and the swinging of states has changed the Democratic and Republic map. The change in representatives in a decade has caused a fear in the primaries for representation.

Mayor Jay Tibshraeny, and Councilmember Kevin Hartke spoke of the key topics on their agendas to help make the City of Chandler prosperous, help and protect local business and attract visitors in order to continue to make Chandler competitive and prosperous.

Diane Douglas, Arizona Department of Education Superintendent, her passion is on equal education, she spoke highly on increasing the pay of teaching, help teachers educate our youth by providing tools and resources for their advancement and to protect and perpetuate Americans.

Sean Bowie, Arizona State Senator of Legislative District 18, also agreed on supporting education and our teachers and aiding students in order to thrive as part of the next generation. In doing so, Senator Bowie has advocated to improve higher education for teachers, restoring education funding for future benefits and increased opportunities for students.

## Arizona Avenue Improvements

Construction is scheduled to begin Monday, January 22nd, in Arizona Avenue between Frye and Pecos roads as part of the Arizona Avenue Improvements Projects. Improvements to Arizona Avenue are part of an overall plan to develop a pedestrian friendly, urban feel to the City’s core and provide a new entryway into downtown Chandler from the Loop 202/Santan Freeway. The first phase of improvements to Arizona Avenue, from Chandler Boulevard to Frye Road was completed in 2010.





## Construction Begins Soon! Arizona Avenue, Pecos to Frye, Improvements Project (Project No. ST1607)

**Project Overview:** In early January, work will begin to construct improvements to Arizona Avenue between Frye and Pecos roads, and waterline installation in Frye Road between Arizona and Nebraska Street. Improvements to Arizona Avenue are part of an overall plan to develop a pedestrian friendly, urban feel to the City's core and provide a new entryway into downtown Chandler from the Loop 202/Santan Freeway. During construction, roads will remain open for travel; however, lane restrictions may be in place to shift traffic away from the work zone. Business and resident access will be maintained during construction, which is **scheduled to be complete in October 2018**.

The project includes asphalt roadway, concrete curb and gutter, sidewalks, driveways, landscape areas, new traffic signal at Fairview, raised median installation, hardscape elements, streetlights, signage and entry monuments, and a new waterline in Frye Road, from Arizona Avenue to Nebraska Street. Drainage improvements or utility relocations may also be necessary as part of the project.

**Construction will begin on the west side of Arizona Avenue**, for approximately 3-4 months; then on the east side of Arizona Avenue for approximately 3-4 months, followed by median island installation in the center of the road and final paving. **Waterline installation in Frye Road is currently scheduled to begin June 2018** to accommodate the school's summer break. Arizona Avenue and Frye Road will remain open for travel during this work; however, lane restrictions and left turn restrictions may be in place to accommodate the work. Thank you for your patience during construction.

  - encourage the participation of others
  - solves problems and exhibit innovative thinking

**COMMUNITY CUP** - The Chandler Chamber of Commerce awards the Community Cup to an organization, individual or couple to show appreciation for outstanding volunteerism and/or other commitment(s) to the community.

**Nominee must:**

live or be located in the Chandler area

have been actively involved in the community for a long period of time (although many community leaders generously lend their name to assist various activities, the Chandler Cup requires that the recipient be actively involved in these activities)

have created a significant difference in the quality of life in Chandler and exhibit a high degree of willingness to help others
