This week, the Arizona Legislature is exactly halfway through the Session. There have been 1,289 bills posted during the session, with 7 passed, 1 vetoed, and 6 signed into law. The issues that have received the most attention during the first half of the session are Drought Contingency Plan (DCP), Tax Conformity, and Empowerment Scholarship Account (ESA) programs. The DCP plan, signed by Governor Doug Ducey, is still under negotiation for Arizona and other Lower Basin States, to complete all necessary steps in order to comply with federal standards. The ESA issue has seen a great deal of controversy, shortly after Prop. 305 was overwhelmingly opposed by voters, and the fact that a state lawmaker has introduced a new bill that is similar to issues presented in the rejected proposition.

The Chandler Chamber of Commerce has been busy this session following issues that will impact the business community. We are working closely with legislative district 17 and 18 lawmakers who have proposed bills to help businesses by streamlining business licensing requirements, like the Regulatory Sandbox program which helps small companies test innovative products directly with consumers, and another to expand space flight programs. Several of our lawmakers are also working on a number of education and workforce development bills, amongst many other issues concerning Chandler and Arizona. As always we will keep our members updated with the latest news on these actions.

CHANDLER CHAMBER **AZ** POLICY IMPACT WRAP-UP

First, Senator Mesnard provided an update on the state's most time-sensitive issues, tax conformity and the drought contingency plan. Concerning tax conformity, Senator Mesnard explained his proposal for a one-time tax-filing deadline delay and pledged to "never support an individual income tax increase." Senator Mesnard also discussed his preferred solutions to vote-counting delays and distracted driving.

With a seat on the House Education Committee and 17 years as a teacher, Representative Pawlik's primary focus is our education system. Highlighting class-size reductions and suicide prevention as priorities, Pawlik demonstrated willingness to work across the aisle to reach pragmatic solutions. For instance, to ensure that school personnel have suicide prevention training, all representatives of Legislative Districts 17 (and 18) support Senate Bill 1468, also known as the Mitch Warnock Act.

Representative Weninger, in sharing his support for an array of bipartisan education bills, also demonstrated his commitment to supporting Arizona schools. Beyond education, Weninger shared a list of his bills exemplifying his commitment to encouraging economic growth and fiscal responsibility while reducing excessive bureaucracy. In supporting property technology, financial technology, rocket deployment, workforce development, and occupational licensing reform, among other causes, Representative Weninger continues to empower entrepreneurs and innovators.

Maricopa County Supervisor, Steve Chucuri spoke at the February 22, 2019 Policy Impact Series. His update began with the question, "how can we become better?" This starts with listening to small businesses and their needs. He stated that government needs to have a business mindset in being good stewards of taxpayers' dollars and for the public to expect more from their elected leaders. Finally, Arizona has begun the steps towards better use of existing government buildings, through repurposing of old buildings and saving money on the costs of new buildings.

The second speaker, Corporation Commissioner Justin Olson, spoke to his advocacy of fiscal policy for the protection of taxpayers, to ensure that the government has no hidden tax increases. The topics included reasonable readjustment of utility rates, revisiting of retail competition, and a competitive market for electric vehicles. Finally, Commissioner Olson shared his opposition of Biomass and addressing its expensive cost in electricity production.
