Thank you, Chandler -- It's been a great ride

When I was first elected to the City Council in 1986, I had no idea what I was in for. Nor did I think that three-plus decades later I would be finishing my seventh term as the mayor of this wonderful city. And, I wouldn't change a thing.

In those early years I was on the Council, we faced some significant challenges. Our financial situation was bleak. And yet, with the coming growth we were sure to face, we had to change that. One of my early goals on Council, as Vice Mayor -- and in my first term as Mayor in 1994, was to fix that. I am proud of all our past Councils for embracing a goal to become one of the most financially stable cities in the country. Had we not, the growth of the 1990's and early 2000's, along with two recessions, could have killed our collective dreams for Chandler.

After eight years in the State Senate, I was privileged to have the people of Chandler welcome me back to the Mayor's office in 2011. I created a number of initiatives of which I am very proud. Coming back during the Great Recession was challenging. We held a job fair that attracted more than a hundred employers and thousands of people -- and we called it Job Connect. From there, we started my Health Connect Initiative, focusing on Mental, Physical and Financial Health. Moving from high growth to sustainability mode, we launched Neighborhood Connect, and ushered in the Mayor's Listening Tour. I will always look back on these programs, knowing that we were able to provide resources for residents to help them improve their lives, while enhancing the overall quality of this City.

Some of the other areas where we made strong progress include Transportation, Parks and Recreation, and Planning and Economic Development. In my first terms as Mayor I was able to move up the construction of the Price Freeway, becoming the first city in the state to utilize a new financing option. That led the acceleration of Chandler Fashion Center, an economic boon to our city.

I have always been an advocate of parks and recreation. We have developed so many amenities that we all can be very proud of, including a new museum, which we dedicated in early December; the 7.5-mile Paseo Trail system; bike park; skate park; arts center; community centers; as well as many pools and libraries -- several in partnership with our school districts.

Through solid and balanced planning, we have created a place where people can truly live, work and play in comfort and safety. We have one of the most robust economies in the Southwest, if not the nation. Our talent pool runs deep, thanks to an outstanding education system. And our employment base is diversified, and ever expanding. Even as a Senator, I fought hard to preserve the dynamic employment center that is the Price Corridor. The Price, with its many anchors -- Intel, Northrup, Wells Fargo, Infusionsoft, and now Allstate -- among dozens of others -- continues to solidify our reputation as the Innovation and Technology Hub of the Southwest.

And, of course, we have, over time, developed the finest public safety departments in the country. That is evident not just in our low crime rate, excellent response times and other statistics, but also in the support the community continues to show for these men and women.

I thoroughly enjoyed serving the region in my time with Maricopa Association of Governments, Greater Phoenix Economic Council and the League of Arizona Cities and Towns. But, when it was announced to me that I was named the City and County Magazine Public Official of the Year, it was extremely special. Special because that recognition was based on the community as a whole. And, as a community, we have done this together. My ideas and efforts mean nothing if it were not for the buy-in of a collective vision.

My proudest accomplishment though has been the time I took to personally work with residents on things of concern to them. Personal conversations, emails, phone calls. I tried to be as responsive as humanly possible. I hope that came through, because it was what I truly enjoyed most about the job. I look forward to continued service as Justice of the Peace. It will keep me in contact with our many residents -- and again, many of them seeking help.

Thanks to all of you for your continued support through the years. I can't begin to tell you what this great ride has meant to me. It's been my privilege to serve you.

Cybersecurity Landscape for Small Business in 2019

According to USA Today, small businesses have become the #1 target of cyber-attacks. Small business owners in the United States are the easiest target because they are the least equipped to protect and properly respond to an attack on a larger scale. Within the next 12 months, 55% of small business will suffer from a cyber-attack. Many of these will go unnoticed for days, months, maybe even years, however the ultimate cost may shut down a business for good. Cyber-attacks can come in many forms; however, most are brought into a business through a phishing email. A phishing email looks like a “normal” email that an employee will open and click on specific links however, malicious malware may be attached to it. Once opened, the computer is affected, which leads to the network. Many go unnoticed because the malware may not release data until a later date. Once the data and or computer is breached the company must notify legal teams, customers, and the state of Arizona. This became a mandated state regulation in August 2018. According to House Bill 2154, each breach of data would result in \$10,000.00 fine and must be notified with 45 days of identifying the breach. With the cost of fines, legal ramifications, and loss of financial services, an average breach for a small business can run \$144,000 a day. With these expenses 60% of small businesses that undergo an attack, end up closing the business within six months because they can’t financially come back from this travesty. Seeking out the correct protection plan prior to an attack from a third-party cyber security specialist is the only way to remain safe in today’s cyber environment. Your small business can be protected for a nominal fee compared to the expense of losing your business completely.

Meet the Chamber's First International Intern, Hughes Pomey From Paris, France

The Chandler Chamber had the pleasure of hosting an international intern from a business school in Paris France during the fall semester. The following are just a few of his experiences and observations while he was visiting in Chandler told in his words.

My name is Hughes Pomey, I am 25 years old and I live in Paris, France. I'm a student in French Business School studying for a Masters in Digital Marketing. I came to Chandler to fulfill credits for my diploma because in French business school, we had to carry out an internship abroad. This international experience through an internship in company in other country, it's to improve our English level and discover new horizons.

I find an intern position at the Chandler Chamber of Commerce, in social media department for 3 months. It was very difficult to find an intern position abroad, thanks to the help of my family, as my Uncle is a member of the Chamber I find it in Arizona. It was very interesting to work in American company to see new work aspects and work culture. Because of the barrier language I was very shy at the beginning, but week after week I improve my English level and it was simpler to communicate with my teammates.



It was my first time in USA and my first time so far from my home! It was very terrifying and exciting at the same time to leave my country for another one. It was a great experience to meet new people and discover new practices in business and socially. People in Arizona are very welcoming and helpful. I stay during my 3 months with a family, in Gilbert, it was the best solution to discover American's traditions. I thank the Chandler Chamber for the valuable experience.

How is the work place environment different? The same?

In France is very current to find open work space areas at office. Perhaps for this point, we have a lot of common points with U.S. work places. Generally the work place environment changes to the function of the company's sectors. We have the both mentality for the work environment, team work and cubicles.

How do jobs markets compare U.S. to France?

The jobs market in France is very difficult, in both country's and companies' philosophy. In France it's difficult to find a position if you don't have a recognized diploma from a great school. Even if mentalities are changing, a lot of recruiters look again the origin of your diploma. In my opinion, there is more opportunity in US jobs market.

Do you have Chambers of commerce in France?

Yes we have Chambers of Commerce in France. We have one Chamber of Commerce per region. They are structured to defend company's interest in their territory against French state, Europe and at international levels. They are intermediary between companies and the French state. I attended many events to help businesses from the Chandler Chamber that would not happen in France.

What food do you like in U.S?

France and United States are both occidental countries but they are not so similar especially in food. During my stay in Arizona I discover Mexican food, the Thanksgiving's turkey and apple pie are very excellent. Regularly I went to the restaurants to eat typical dishes like burgers and barbecue food.

What has been your favorite place to visit?

I really appreciate the diversity of Arizona's landscapes with Sedona's mountains and the Grand Canyon for example—very incredible and beautiful places.


