The following is a letter that was sent to CUSD Parents regarding opening plans for the district.



July 1, 2020

Dear CUSD Families and Staff,

The circumstances surrounding COVID-19 continues to be fluid. On Monday, June 29, 2020, Governor Doug Ducey announced that all schools shall delay the start for in-person instruction until August 17, 2020.

We have reviewed the latest Executive Order and how it applies to our proposed reopening plan. **At this time, we want to share that we will still welcome our students back for their first day of instruction on Wednesday, August 5th. Until we can open schools for in-person services, all instruction will be delivered through our Chandler Online Academy (COA) or a virtual format.**

In order to plan and staff appropriately, we will be asking you to select your student(s) preferred delivery system when schools can reopen.

1. *Online Only* (for those who plan to attend Chandler Online Academy for a minimum of one quarter). Kindergarten-6 will enroll in Elementary Connect @ COA; Grades 7-12 will enroll in COA. Florida Virtual Curriculum or customized courses will be offered for a number of areas. Both of these programs will have increased teacher interaction compared to a typical online course.

2. *The in-person option for grades K-12*, will begin the school year through a virtual learning experience using Google Classroom. The student will be assigned to a teacher(s) from their enrolled school with an established schedule in order to cover all areas of the curriculum. The teacher and students will transition to in-person at the school site when allowed to do so.

NOTE: Grades 7-12

The in-person and online option (concurrent enrollment) will be available for grades 7-12 when schools are allowed to open for in-person instruction. In the meantime, this option will be delivered virtually.

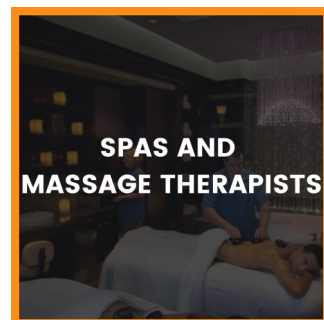
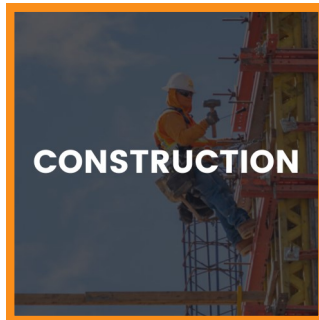
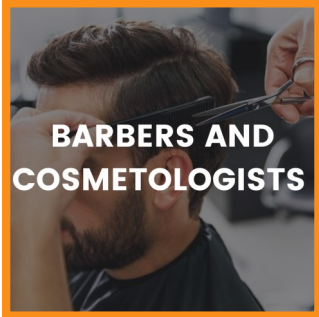

Please be on the lookout for additional communication in the next few days, beginning with a **Question and Answer document, followed by enrollment forms in which you will be asked to choose the preferred learning model for your child(ren).**

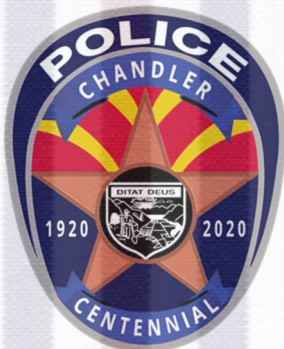


This has been a trying year for our business community. Through the pandemic the City of Chandler has worked diligently with community partners to provide support and resources for our businesses, and we are committed to continuing those efforts. The City's Economic Development Division, in partnership with the Industrial Development Authority, recently launched the Choose Chandler reimbursement grant program to assist small businesses with costs incurred from purchasing personal protective equipment (PPE). This will help ensure that businesses can offer a safe work environment for their employees and their customers.

The Chandler Industrial Development Authority has made a total of \$200,000 available for the program. Qualifying Chandler businesses can apply for a grant in amounts between \$100 and \$500 for reimbursable PPE purchases that were procured after March 11, 2020. Applications are reviewed on a first-come, first-serve basis and reimbursement opportunities will be available until grant funds are exhausted. More information and the application can be found at chandleraz.gov/ChooseChandlerGrants.

Council continues to work with City staff to identify the best plan to distribute the CARES Act funding that Chandler was allocated by the State in June. I will be sure to share details with the community as soon as a plan is solidified.

I want to reiterate my appreciation for our business community and your patience and collaboration as we have navigated these uncharted territories. We will get through this together.

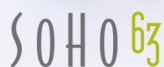

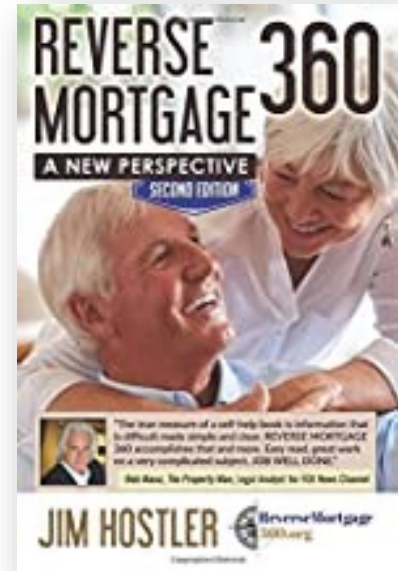
