Departing board members and the year's achievements were highlighted at the gathering, and award winners were recognized for their accomplishments.

The following members and firms were honored during the awards ceremony:



Randy Morris of **Morris Government Relations, LLC** was honored with this year's **Tom Roche Lifetime Achievement Award** (pictured on left with 2016 recipient, Glenn Schreiner of WSP | USA). This award is presented to an individual who has contributed a great deal during their career to the engineering profession, ACEC/MN, and the community. Randy has had a long-standing commitment to ACEC, serving as the association's lobbyist for over 15 years. Over that time, he has steered numerous bills that were favorable and fought against bills that were detrimental to the engineering profession. As a result of his dedication, he has raised the consulting engineering profile at the Capitol. Randy is the third non-engineer to be recognized with this trophy since its inception in 1975.

The **2017 Firm of the Year Award** was presented to **Burns & McDonnell**

Engineers-Consultants. This award is presented to an ACEC/MN firm that has made a significant contribution to the advancement of the association and the consulting engineering profession. This firm has a long history of giving back to the association – its employees attend events and serve on committees and the board of directors. Its employees are also large supporters of the ACEC/MN PAC. Regional Manager, Gene Sieve, was instrumental in creating the ACEC/MN

ACEC worked with the Kasma family in an effort to remember "Dewey" by naming the yearly softball scholarship fundraiser after him. In return, the family annually makes a generous donation in memory of Dewey that will be added to the ACEC Scholarship Fund. DuWayne "Dewey" Kasma was a registered civil engineer. He graduated from the University of Minnesota and worked his entire career at TKDA from 1963 until his death at age 48 in 1988. He managed the Municipal Department from 1968 to 1976, established TKDA's Marketing Department and was named Vice President and a member of the Board of Directors in 1978. He was a member of ACEC, MPWA, CEAM and MSPE.

Seeking Engineer Representative for Construction Codes Advisory Council (CCAC)

The Department of Labor and Industry (DOLI) is seeking a licensed professional engineer to serve on the Construction Codes Advisory Council (CCAC). Tom Downs, who has served in that capacity for several years, is stepping down from the position.

The board reviews codes, rules, standards, and licensing requirements relating to building construction. It may make recommendations about ways to eliminate inconsistencies, to streamline construction regulation and construction procedures and to improve procedures within and among jurisdictions. The council may also review and comment on current and proposed laws and rules to promote coordination and consistency and advise agencies on possible changes in rules to make them easier to understand and apply, and also promote the coordination, within each jurisdiction, of the administration and enforcement of construction codes.

The board meets four times a year, generally on the third Thursday of the month from 10:00 am to noon at the Department of Labor and Industry St. Paul office.
