Dr. Hawks is a board-certified general surgeon with more than 15 years of experience. He received his bachelor's degree in biology from the Pacific Union College in Angwin, California. Dr. Hawks graduated with his medical degree and completed residency training in general surgery at Loma Linda University in California. Dr. Hawks completed two fellowships - first in surgical critical care, followed by trauma and acute care surgery - at the University of Miami Jackson Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Hawks comes to Pensacola from practicing trauma and acute care surgery at Jackson Memorial Hospital and Fort Walton Beach Medical Center. He previously led the Special Operations Surgical Team (SOST) at Hurlburt Field and practiced general surgery at Eglin Air Force Base.

He is a colonel in the U.S. Air Force Reserve Command and a veteran of 10 deployments in support of U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force and Marine Special Operations Forces on four continents. He was also deployed with the first medical and surgical teams to Haiti following the 2010 earthquake. He is a recipient of numerous awards, including the Bronze Star, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Joint Service Commendation Medal, and the Humanitarian Service Medal.

He is a diplomat of the American Board of Surgery and a member of the Special Operations Medical Association, the American Medical Association and the Florida Medical Association.
