											16/ - "information professionals who manage information resources for professional employees"? Wow -- this represents a total disconnect for me. The point of SIG/MGT to start with was that graduate school programs in infosci had little if ANY coursework devoted to managing STAFF. Not managing information resources. It is STAFF management that is so critical -- which you have boiled down to "human resources - management" And it is the ability to make presentations to management to justify new approaches to information collection and dissemination. YES, being able to conduct, capsulize and present cost-benefit analyses of information products and delivery of information services are critical. Also, being able to design and evaluate qualitative surveys -- to measure the impact, positive or negative, of existing information products and services -- in order to justify continued funding of staff. That this statement is so blind to management science suggests to me that the folks who are rebooting SIG/MGT are largely academics, and not managers in the information industry.
											27/ I would add the following to the charge: SIG MGT generally supports research on and discussion of the management of information organizations and the organizational management of information. Specifically it supports research and discussion of various management topics as they apply to information organizations like academic libraries or information centers, and as they apply to information services within organizations like special libraries, records management units, or archives. These topics reflect activity at different levels of organizational practice and analysis. For instance, ones of motivation and perception affect individuals' organizational work. The topics of group dynamics, group conflict, and teams reflect the work of small sets (groups) of people. Finally, at the organizational level, occur the work reflected in the topics of power; leadership; organizational structure, change, communication, and effectiveness; strategy; and knowledge management. The purpose of SIG-MGT shall include but not be limited to 1) advising the Board of Directors of the Society officers on matters pertaining to SIG-MGT's interests and areas; 2) organizing sessions at conferences of the Society and at other times; 3) collecting and disseminating information concerning areas of interest; and 4) at the request of the Board of Directors, either as a Group or through one or more of its officers or members, representing the Society in international, interdisciplinary and inter-organizational activities.
											18/ The specific reference to cost-benefit analysis of information activities relates to my dissertation research on information behaviour and information use of financial economic actors. I welcome the opportunity to be involved with ASIS&T/SIG/MGT as a student member, and I hope to attend the annual conference this year to find out more about how this affiliation may enhance my work. I do not know how ASIS&T/SIG/MGT may be more involved with my process to complete my dissertation research. [NETWORKING]
											19/ Our company is ensconced on the cusp of technological change, and as a service provider we've long since moved beyond the traditional data dissemination models in which similar professionals associations seem stuck.
