

What Should I Take with Me When I'm Representing the Library at a Community Event?

Help! You've been asked to represent your library at a table at a community event. What should you take with you to make sure you show your library in the best light and are an effective presence? Below is a basic kit to follow, plus some add-on options to make it even better!

Basic Library Road Show Kit:

- 1. Tri-fold panel for visual display can be foamboard, but a reusable metal/plastic and fabric version saves money over the long run and can easily be customized
- 2. Plexiglas document holders for flyers and brochures Great way to keep them corralled on a windy day
- 3. Tablecloth imprinted with library name/logo if you can afford. If not, stick with covering event has on table when you arrive. Plain tablecloth is a good idea for backup, as some events don't give a tablecloth and tables can be pretty beat up!
- 4. Giveaways imprinted with library logo and contact information (logo and phone number) and sometimes address. These drive people to your table!
- 5. Office supplies tape, scissors, Velcro (if using reusable fabric tri-fold). Basically anything you might need to make emergency repairs.

Optional Add-ons:

- 1. Spinning prize wheel Use it to distribute giveaway items. The space they land on correlates to a specific giveaway item! Adds interactivity.
- 2. Laptop or tablet PC use it to run a looped video/PowerPoint about the library, demo downloadable and/or streaming media services, or sign up people for new library cards.
- 3. Canopy Some outdoor events provide these, but not all do. Can be handy if it's raining or shade is desirable.
