ALABAMA'S DAPHNE-FAIRHOPE-FOLEY

IS THE 12TH FASTEST GROWING METRO IN THE U.S.

labama is home to four of the 100 fastest-growing metros in the United States, including one in the top 12.

Daphne-Fairhope-Foley, the metro area that's home to Alabama's beaches in Baldwin County, grew by 3% between July 2021 and July 2022. That was enough to rank as the 12th-fastest growing metro in the nation, according to recently released population estimates from the U.S. Census Bureau.

It trailed a number of fellow Southern metros, including seven in Florida and two in the Carolinas. St. George, Utah, and Greeley, Co., were the only non-Southern metros in the top 12.

Among other Alabama metros near the top of the list was the Huntsville metro, which ranked inside the top 50 at No. 41. Already Alabama's second largest metro in terms of population, it grew 2.1% from 2021 to 2022.

The Auburn-Opelika metro in east Alabama grew by 1.8%, the 56th fastest rate in the nation. And the

Florence-Muscle Shoals metro in far northwest Alabama just barely cracked the top 100, coming in at No. 99 with a growth rate of 0.9% from 2021 to 2022.

But not all Alabama metros faired as well. The Birmingham-Hoover metro area, for instance, was stagnant, neither growing nor shrinking significantly. The Birmingham metro is still by far the largest in Alabama, home to more than 1.1 million residents, more than twice as many as second-place Huntsville.

The Birmingham metro is unique because it has so many individual cities and towns - 77 in all - and population trends in the metro show the central core cities are losing people, while cities and towns on the outskirts of the metro are growing. And the Mobile metro in south Alabama, just across the bay from fast-growing Daphne-Fairhope-Foley, shrank by 0.4%, the biggest population loss of any Alabama metro area. [...]



REFURBISHED 1925 FOLEY BUILDING OPENS AS CHAMBER OFFICES

Foley is known as The Forward City and is already home to major manufacturers in the aluminum and aerospace industries. You can now add solar power to that list. Construction of a massive solar farm will begin this fall on Craft Turf Farm property west of town. The 620-acre site will be purchased by Hecate Energy now that the city has approved a zoning change to allow it.

"Alabama Power was looking at seven sites from around Alabama to expand their portfolio of solar energy and this site I believe moved up in importance because of the Novelis plant and they, needing green energy. The immediate effect of taxes will be to the Baldwin County School Board (taxes not abated) - many hundreds of thousands of dollars per year." - Foley Mayor Ralph Hellmich





BBB News: Employment scams: Reports of Job Scams Skyrocket in 2023, Costing Job Seekers Millions

seekers, beware. In the first three months of 2023, Better Business Bureau (BBB) Scam Tracker received reported losses of nearly \$840,000, up over 250% compared to last year. With a median loss of over \$1,500 during that timeframe, job hunters tell BBB the financial impact is devastating.

Since BBB issued the 2021 study, Job Scams: BBB study finds job scams increased during the pandemic and warns job seekers to verify employment offers to avoid illegal jobs, identity theft, and fake checks, the blistering pace at which fraudsters ensnare the public in employment scams has increased each year, according to BBB data. In extreme cases, some individuals found themselves in a deep financial hole with little recourse.

- How do employment scams work? People 18-34 age range at the most risk for employment scams.
- Job seekers should always have their guard up. Scammers find resumes on job listing sites like Indeed and tailored their scams to an individual's background, sometimes impersonate real companies, tarnishing the names of legitimate businesses. [...]
