VIA Names New President and CEO



The VIA Metropolitan Transit Board of Trustees voted unanimously Tuesday, Nov. 12, 2024, to appoint a new President and CEO to lead the region's mobility provider.

Jon Gary Herrera will succeed Jeffrey C. Arndt as President/CEO at VIA, beginning Jan. 4, 2025.

During his tenure, Arndt and his team ushered in a time of transformation for the agency that first rolled out service in 1978 and has

grown as an industry leader in safety, innovation and customer satisfaction.

The much-decorated CEO, Jeffrey Arndt will be retiring after 40 years in the transportation Industry and 13 years behind the wheel at VIA, leaving the agency as the "Most Outstanding Metropolitan Transit Authority in Texas," a distinction earned three times under Arndt's leadership.

Jon Gary Herrera, a San Antonio native, has served as VIA's Senior Vice President of Public Engagement since 2017, overseeing efforts to deliver major milestones, including the historic 2020 initiative to secure additional funding for VIA's Keep SA Moving plan. Read more here

Houston Metro to Receive 1.2 Million from FTA




METRO has been awarded \$1.2 million from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to plan for transit -oriented development (TOD) along the proposed Gulfton Corridor Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) line.

The funding will enable the creation of a comprehensive TOD strategy focused on enhancing mobility, housing, and community development in one of Houston's most transit-dependent areas.

A joint effort among METRO, Harris County Commissioner Lesley Briones, and Houston Mayor John Whitmire, the project aims to attract public and private investment and establish a community-supported vision for TOD. The initiative will also explore green infrastructure solutions to address urban heat and flooding.

TxDOT: STAR Transit Helping Rural Community through Service Expansion Program



STAR Transit helping the rural community one rider at a time through the Service Expansion Program (SEP)

Access to transportation services in rural areas is crucial for individuals' livelihoods, families, and daily activities. Nineteen Texas rural transit agencies are currently participating in a TxDOT-sponsored Service Expansion Program (SEP), which launched on July 1, 2024, under the guidance of TxDOT's Public Transportation Division.

The goal of the SEP is to expand services in unserved and underserved areas by employ-

ing efficient combinations of design, resources, technology, and quality service. This could involve adding more routes to areas lacking adequate transportation or enhancing existing services to

improve connectivity with other transportation options. In addition to increasing service coverage areas, there will be measurable outcomes such as improving access to transit, enhancing customer satisfaction, reducing wait times, and fostering greater connectivity between transit services.

One of the agencies participating in the SEP is STAR Transit. STAR currently operates STARnow, an app-based on-demand microtransit service. As part of the program, STAR has extended their weekday hours of STARnow in Kaufman and Forney, increasing service from 8 a.m.–5 p.m. to 6 a.m.–6 p.m. Additionally, in Terrell, STARnow added an extra hour of service on weekdays to its popular Saturday routes.





STAR Transit Executive Director Tommy Hendricks said that the service has experienced an increase in new riders, higher trip volumes and shorter wait times. With the extended Saturday hours, dialysis patients and others now have more weekend transportation options, offering them greater flexibility. Over the past couple of months, average monthly trips have nearly doubled, rising from 764 to 1,611. Daily trips have also increased, from 37 to 81 on average, and average wait times have decreased from 29 minutes to 18 minutes. "Over the past month, we've seen positive feedback from our riders with our expanded services and we are thankful for this opportunity from TxDOT in helping our community thrive" Hendricks added.



WTEP Paratransit Conference 2024



The West Texas El Paso Regional Coordination Committee (WTEP) recently hosted its Paratransit Conference in El Paso, Texas, bringing together transit agencies, health and human services organizations, community members, and stakeholders for an engaging discussion on public transit. The event focused on removing barriers to paratransit services, expanding public transit education, and fostering opportunities for regional coordination.

One highlight of the event was a presentation by **Vince Huerta**, immediate past president and current Board member of the Texas Transit Association (TTA). Vince shared insights into Texas transit initiatives and advancements, detailing innovative efforts to improve accessibility, enhance regional cooperation, and address the growing need for effective

Also in attendance was **Alfredo Gonzalez** from TxDOT and **Xavier Banales**, Project Amistad Board member. The overall participation reflected the broad support and collaboration needed to drive progress in public transit and paratransit services.

This year's conference showcased the power of partnership and coordination, emphasizing the importance of removing barriers and creating inclusive transit solutions for all. The WTEP Paratransit Conference continues to serve as a critical platform for advancing the future of public transportation in West Texas and beyond.



Vince Huerta Visits Sun Metro to Explore Transit Innovations

Vince recently visited **Sun Metro** in El Paso to learn about their transformative transit initiatives. Sun Metro is implementing major changes to improve operations, enhance services, and embrace innovative technologies.



Highlights included the optimization of the **Sun Metro Streetcar**, which achieved a **168.5% increase in ridership** by extending hours and reallocating resources without additional funding. The agency's **Sun Metro Rising for Fixed Route** plan aims to revamp the bus system by late 2025, offering simpler routes, better connections, and ADA-compliant infrastructure, while preparing for a **Microtransit pilot program**.

Sun Metro is also diversifying its **Paratransit LIFT** fleet with 45 electric vehicles and charging stations, launching in 2026, and has secured \$44 million in grants to replace vehicles and improve transit operations. Vince's visit underscored the agency's commitment to innovation, sustainability, and improving transit for the City of El Paso, setting a benchmark for agencies statewide.
