Transit Victory at the Capitol but the Fight Continues



Earlier this month, a proposed amendment to Senate Bill 1 aimed to divert millions in funding from small urban and rural transit systems. This would have meant a devastating cut to services that many Texans rely on every single day. These aren't just numbers on paper — they represent real people losing access to jobs, healthcare, schools, and opportunities.

Thanks to a coordinated action across the State, the amendment has officially been pulled. Legislators heard your voices — loud, clear, and unified. Phone calls were made. Emails were sent. Advocates stepped up. And most importantly, the transit community stood strong together.

We owe this win to every advocate who refused to let this slide under the radar. Your persistence made the difference.

However, this is just a reminder that transit can become a target at any moment, and we can't afford to be caught off guard. While we celebrate this moment, we will continue to monitor the countless bills and any new threats that could emerge.

For this reason, the Texas Transit Association's Legislative Committee is now meeting weekly, tracking legislation, and staying alert to any issues that could impact the future of public transportation in Texas. This work is critical — and ongoing. We're proud of this victory, but this Legislative session is far from being over.

Current News <u>Spartan Holds a Measles Vaccine Clinic and Testing Site</u>



LUBBOCK, Texas — SPARTAN Public Transportation said in a press release they are partnering with the Texas Department of State Health Services to host a free measles vaccination clinic and testing site at the SPAR-TAN facility in Levelland.

"They needed some space to help facilitate the distribution of those vaccines for measles and also a space to do some testing," said communications director for South Plains Community Action, Samantha Mendoza. "We were more than happy to be able to partner up with them."

According to the press release, the vaccine clinic was held starting March 31 every Monday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the SPARTAN Transportation facility, located at 1105 TX-114 in Levelland, Texas. The clinic was open to all members of the community until April 14.

SWART Introduces Vanpool Program



SWART is offering funding to further reduce the expenses of this already cost-efficient form of commuting. In partnership with TxDOT, SWART is providing \$600 per van per month for vanpools starting in its eight-county service area.

"Vanpooling represents more than just a ride to work—it's a powerful tool for strengthening our region. By reducing congestion, lowering commuting costs, and filling in critical transit gaps, we're creating a more connected, equitable, and sustainable future for our workforce. This program is a smart investment not only in mobility, but in the quality of life for our entire region," states SWART General Manager, Sarah Hidalgo-Cook.

Participants can choose an available qualifying vanpool vehicle from a selection of Commute with Enterprise makes and models, including crossovers, SUVs, minivans, and large passenger vans. Each vanpool rider pays a portion of the total cost, which covers all expenses such as gas, insurance, maintenance, and repairs. Commute with Enterprise also provides 24-hour roadside assistance.

"Vanpooling gives commuters time back in their day and helps them save on transportation costs," said Sirus Karimi, Vice President of Commute with Enterprise. "We work closely with our partner employers and public transit agencies to offer convenient vanpool programs that support more sustainable commuting, help fill transit service gaps, and reduce congestion while helping employers offer a competitive benefit that can attract and retain talent."

CapMetro Showcases Level 4 Autonomous Bus (YARD) Yard Automation Research and Deployment

On April 10, 2025, CapMetro hosted its Yard Autonomous Research Demonstration (YARD) project demo day, marking the culmination of more than two years of groundbreaking work on autonomous vehicle technology. Funded through the FTA's Strategic Transit Automation Research (STAR) program, CapMetro was

awarded nearly \$1 million in 2023 to develop and demonstrate a Level 4 autonomous bus system.

The project utilized a 40' New Flyer Xcelsior, a 100% battery-electric transit bus from CapMetro's regular fleet. Under the leadership of CapMetro staff — including Project Manager Jo Namayanja and Project Lead David Carr — the initiative brought together a diverse and skilled team, with critical contributions from internal staff, the Keolis maintenance team, and partner organizations such as WSP, TTI, Perrone Robotics, Clever Devices, and the FTA.

The two-day demonstration included a closed rehearsal and a public showcase attended by more than 120 stakeholders, partners, and community members.

Attendees witnessed the autonomous bus perform complex yard maneuvers without human input — including **driverless**

navigation through narrow lanes, pedestrian detection and response,

autonomous parking, bus wash routing, and precision docking for pantograph charging.



Sweeping Tariffs Shake the Auto Industry and its Consumers


The East Lansing-based Anderson Economic Group released a revised estimate last week, which spells out a wide range of potential tariff-related costs for some cars, SUVs and trucks.

The extra tariff-related cost is estimated to range from \$2,500 to \$4,000 for some small crossovers, sedans, and one midsize SUV assembled in the United States, according to the report. The Honda Civic and Honda Odyssey had high U.S. content and one of the lowest tariff costs in the group. The Chevy Malibu, VW Jetta and Ford Explorer are also in this group, but the Anderson report said those vehicles were less impacted by tariffs.

Yet we could see a \$5,000 to \$8,500 jump in costs due to tariffs, the report noted, when it comes to many midsize vehicles, including a passenger van, an SUV, and some pickup trucks. Some Jeep, Ram and Toyota truck models are in this category, as are the Chrysler Pacifica van and the Ford Bronco Sport.
