## Speaker Information for Monday, June 26 (in order of appearance)



**Andrew H. Hirshfeld, *Commissioner for Patents – USPTO***

Andrew (Drew) Hirshfeld is Commissioner for Patents for the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. He was appointed to the position in July 2015. He leads and manages more than 10,000 employees as the patent organization's chief operating officer, and manages and directs all aspects of patent operations, examination policy, patent quality management, international patent cooperation, resources and planning, and budget administration. In his previous role as Deputy Commissioner for Patent Examination Policy, Mr. Hirshfeld served as an authority on patent laws, rules, and examining practice and procedure, and provided oversight and direction for the Offices of Petitions, Patent Legal Administration, and the Manual of Patent Examining Procedure. Mr. Hirshfeld previously served as Chief of Staff to the Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Director of the USPTO. He began his career at the USPTO in 1994 as a Patent Examiner, became a Supervisory Patent Examiner in 2001, and was promoted to the Senior Executive Service in 2008 as a Group Director in Technology Center 2100, Computer Architecture and Software. Mr. Hirshfeld holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Vermont, and a J.D. from Western New England College School of Law.



**Dr. Kening Li, *Chief of IP Group, China – Miller Canfield***

Dr. Kening Li leads the Intellectual Property Group of Miller Canfield in China. He has over two decades of experience practicing intellectual property and commercial law in the U.S. and China. Prior to joining Miller Canfield, he was a partner, and Head of IP, Asia Pacific, for Pinsent Masons LLP, shareholder in the Washington DC office of Baker Donelson Bearman Caldwell & Berkowitz PC, Counsel with Crowell & Morning LLP and Associate at Foley & Lardner, LLP in Washington DC. He also served as Senior Counsel for E. I. DuPont de Nemours & Co in Delaware. Dr. Li assists clients, ranging from start-up to Fortune 500 companies, in managing IP assets as an integral part of their comprehensive competition strategy. He is experienced in formulating overall IP strategy, leveraging IP assets in investment transactions, enforcing IP rights in courts and administrative agencies, resolving difficult freedom-to-operate obstacles, negotiating licensing agreements, and effectively utilizing existing intellectual property portfolio to strengthen client's competitive positions. In China, he and his team members advise multinational companies on business and IP strategies, including patent and trademark filing, oppositions, and enforcement, IP due diligence and FTO analysis, licensing arrangements, research and collaboration agreements, and IP enforcement and litigation. Dr. Li's unique understanding of the way government operates in China has allowed him to offer valuable services to western companies starting or expanding their business operations in China. Dr. Li has also advised clients in regard to China's data privacy and data protection laws and regulations, and to e-commerce related IP issues, including news aggregator liability, as well as online anti-counterfeiting campaigns. Dr. Li is a member of American Bar Association, the License Executives Society, American Association for the Advancement of Sciences, and the Chinese Intellectual Property Law Society.



**Anan Sivananthan, *Partner – Bird & Bird***

Anan Sivananthan is a partner in Bird & Bird's Intellectual Property Group and is based in Singapore. He has particular experience in patent litigation, patent management and monetisation, as well as trademark litigation and other high value IP dispute resolution matters. Anan is also experienced in managing anti-counterfeiting matters. Before joining the firm in early 2017, Anan was the Associate Vice President of a Singapore-based global company engaged in the design, manufacture and distribution of multimedia and consumer electronics products where he oversaw the company's legal matters globally, with a focus on worldwide IP registration, litigation, enforcement and all other types of contentious matters. He has handled major patent litigations in Singapore and internationally, including a number in the US International Trade Commission, in various US District Courts, and in Europe. Anan is a regular public speaker and panelist on issues including brand management, commercialising patents and trademark issues. He has been active in the Licensing Executives Society (LES), including being a Committee Member of the Singapore Chapter for 2-3 years until 2015.



**Eloise Maki, *Assistant Chief IP Counsel – 3M***

Eloise Maki has worked as an intellectual property attorney at 3M for 30 years. At 3M, Eloise supported a wide range of 3M businesses and staff groups. For over 20 years, she has managed 3M intellectual property staff and operations. Her intellectual property legal experience and management experience is diverse and global, including managing 3M's trademark function, managing 3M's European, Middle East and North African IP legal operation, its international IP legal operations, and most recently, she returned from Shanghai, China where she managed 3M's Asia Pacific IP legal operations. Eloise now leads the IP legal group supporting 3M's Corporate Laboratories and leads 3M's Patent Liaison Group.





**Goujun Zhou, *Managing Patent Counsel – Intel Corporation***

Goujun is a managing patent counsel at Intel. In the past 15 years, Goujun has worked on patent prosecution, portfolio management, global patent strategies, patent analysis to support licensing and litigation activities, etc. Over the years, he has gained substantial experiences in many international-patent-related legal areas including, for example, foreign filing license, inventor remuneration, utility model practices, export regulations, PCT practice, all across various jurisdictions. Goujun obtained his B.S. and M.S. degrees, both in electrical engineering, in China.

He also holds a Ph.D. in electrical engineering from Duke University. He worked as an engineer in China, in Singapore, and in the U.S. for many years. He holds several patents. Goujun earned his J.D. (cum laude) from Northwest School of Law of Lewis & Clark College in Portland, Oregon. Goujun rotated to Asia from the U.S. in 2016 and currently lives in Taipei. He now focuses on Intel's international patents, particularly in the APAC region.



**John Cheek, *Chief IP Counsel - Tenneco***

John Cheek is Chief IP Counsel for Fortune 500 technology and manufacturing leader Tenneco Inc. (NYSE: TEN), one of the world's leading designers, manufacturers and distributors of clean air and ride performance products and systems for the automotive, commercial truck and off-highway markets and the aftermarket. Prior to joining Tenneco in 2017, Mr. Cheek was Senior Corporate Counsel/Managing Attorney with Caterpillar Inc., the world's leading manufacturer of construction and mining equipment, diesel and natural gas engines, locomotives, and industrial gas turbines, where he served in leadership roles in the United States and Europe. Mr. Cheek is also an active supporter of civil legal aid, most recently serving as Vice President of Prairie State Legal Services. Prior to joining Caterpillar in 1997, Mr. Cheek was in private practice in Dayton, Ohio. Mr. Cheek received an undergraduate degree in Mathematics and Economics from Wabash College and completed additional undergraduate studies in Physics and Mechanical Engineering at the University of Dayton and Bradley University. He also received a Juris Doctor from the University of Dayton and a Masters of Business Administration from the University of Chicago's Booth School of Business. He is a regular lecturer on intellectual property strategy and management at the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University.

**Jennifer Stec, *Intellectual Property Counsel – Ford Global Technologies, LLC***

Jennifer Stec has a B.S.E.E. and has been practicing IP law in the vehicle telematics/connectivity space for more than 20 years. She developed and manages Ford's connectivity and data analytics patent portfolio, manages related infringement litigation, and negotiates IP terms in supply, partnership and M&A transactions. She also has responsibility for copyrights including open source software, both in-vehicle and in conjunction with Smart Device Link, a Ford-developed interface protocol between the vehicle and mobile apps that Ford recently launched as an open source industry standard.



**Lily Lim, *Partner – Finnegan, Henderson, Farabow, Garrett & Dunner, LLP***

Lily Lim represents clients in court and counsels clients on intellectual property, cybersecurity, and privacy issues, offering insight where technology intersects with the law. Ms. Lim has prevailed at trial and on appeal in cases involving patent, copyright, and trade secret disputes in federal court and before the U.S. International Trade Commission (ITC). She represents U.S. and international clients whose technologies include integrated circuits, satellite technologies, wireless devices, software, and medical devices and diagnostic equipment. Ms. Lim also provides strategic pre-litigation counseling regarding negotiating patent and software licenses and international manufacturing and marketing agreements. Ms. Lim provides strategic counseling on cybersecurity and privacy best practices, including security-by-design and privacy-by-design, utilizing her depth of knowledge in both law and technology. Ms. Lim is a Certified Information Privacy Professional (CIPP/US). Ms. Lim is a frequently invited speaker and contributes to the Sedona Conference Working Group on data security and privacy issues. Prior to joining private practice, Ms. Lim served as a law clerk to the Honorable S. Jay Plager of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. She also worked as a spacecraft navigation engineer at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory on the Magellan Project that successfully mapped the surface of Venus.



**Professor Keith Winstein, *Stanford University***

Keith Winstein is an assistant professor of computer science and, by courtesy, of law at Stanford University. His research group has recently worked on high-performance video and image compression and improving the performance of Internet-connected medical devices in the developing world. He is a member of the Secure Internet of Things Project, a collaboration between Stanford, U.C. Berkeley, and the University of Michigan, and has proposed a "right to eavesdrop on your own things." Winstein was previously a staff reporter at The Wall Street Journal (2007-2010) and consulting engineer at Dropbox (2014-2017).



**Tyler Newby, *Partner – Fenwick & West LLP***

Tyler Newby is a partner in the San Francisco office of Fenwick & West LLP, where he focuses his practice on privacy and data security litigation, counseling and investigations, as well as intellectual property and commercial disputes affecting high technology and data driven companies. In addition to being a member of the firm's litigation group, he co-chairs Fenwick's Privacy and Data Security practice. Tyler regularly advises companies large and small on responding to data security incidents, and he has an active practice in defending companies in consumer class actions, state attorney general investigations and federal regulatory and criminal investigations arising out of privacy and data security incidents. In addition to his litigation practice, he counsels companies on privacy and data security best practices to help them reduce the risk of future litigation. Prior to rejoining Fenwick & West in 2011, Tyler was a Trial Attorney with the U.S. Department of Justice's Computer Crime and Intellectual Property Section. As a federal prosecutor, Tyler investigated and prosecuted intellectual property and cybercrimes nationwide, and advised federal law enforcement on compliance with the Fourth Amendment, the Electronic Communications Privacy Act, and other statutes pertaining to electronic surveillance and the search and seizure of electronic information. While at the Department of Justice, Tyler also served as a Special Assistant United States Attorney in the Cyber Unit of the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Virginia in Alexandria, Virginia. As a Special Assistant, Tyler prosecuted fraud, intellectual property and computer intrusion offenses. Tyler currently co-chairs the American Bar Association Litigation Section's Privacy and Data Security Committee. In 2014, Tyler was named among the top privacy attorneys in the United States under the age of 40 by Law360. He was among only three attorneys recognized nationwide for privacy work. Tyler received his J.D. degree from *Stanford Law School* in 1999 where he was a member, Notes Editor and Associate Editor for the Stanford Law Review. He graduated *summa cum laude* and Phi Beta Kappa, with an A.B. degree in history from Dartmouth College in 1996.



**Laura Lemire, *Privacy Attorney – Microsoft Corporation***

Laura Lemire is a privacy and security attorney in Microsoft's Regulatory Affairs group in Redmond, Washington. She advises on data protection matters worldwide and shapes policies and regulations for emerging technologies, such as artificial intelligence and the Internet of Things. Laura's Microsoft career began prior to law school. Today, Laura continues to liaise regularly with the company's engineers and developers. Laura's unique experience enables her to work with legislative staff, policy advocates, regulators and organizations in the development of data protection laws, standards and regulations. Leveraging her privacy expertise, she also participates in the civic tech movement, championing smart uses of data and technology to help people, cities, and municipalities thrive. Laura joined Microsoft in 2000. She holds a J.D. from the Seattle University School of Law and a B.A. from the University of Michigan. She is a member of the Washington State Bar and a Certified Information Privacy Professional (CIPP/US).



**Monica Winghart, *Partner – Centric Legal Services***

Monica is a founding partner of Centric Legal, a law firm specializing in working with entrepreneurial companies in high growth and expansion markets, and her focus is on intellectual property, data protection, patent monetization, privacy and licensing matters. She is currently the CLO of Globiana Inc. which provides relocation support services on its proprietary cloud platform for companies and their internationally relocated employees. Monica is also concurrently the GC of Creatubbles PTE Ltd. which provides children with a safe, global social network for sharing artwork and creativity. Previously, Monica was EVP/GC of Article One Partners, a global crowdsourcing company specializing in the discovery and use of prior art in strategic patent litigation, licensing and prosecution matters. Monica also worked with The Clorox Company where she was Director of IP litigation, functioned as lead counsel for the three of the company's largest business units and served on the M&A, compliance, social media, and transactions teams. Earlier in her legal career, Monica was an IP attorney with firms in Los Angeles and Atlanta. Before attending law school, Monica worked as an engineer with Procter & Gamble and was the principle in an engineering consulting firm. Monica

is recognized as one of the world's leading IP strategists in the IAM Strategy 300 and she serves as an advisor on IP, social media, privacy and data protection matters for several government organizations. She is a past Chair of the IP Committee for the Association of Corporate Counsel and a member of various Silicon Valley/San Francisco Bay area and national professional and philanthropic organizations, including currently serving as a board member and Secretary for the East Bay SPCA. Monica is a member of the California and Georgia Bars and is a USPTO registered patent attorney. She holds a JD from Tulane Law School and a BS in Chemical Engineering and a BS in Pulp and Paper Technology from North Carolina State University. Monica is an avid sports fan, an aspiring pilot, soccer coach and outdoor enthusiast. She lives in the Bay area with her three children and a menagerie of pets.



**Kevin Rhodes, *President and Chief IP Counsel – 3M***

Kevin Rhodes is a Vice President and the Chief Intellectual Property Counsel of 3M Company, and the President and Chief Intellectual Property Counsel of 3M Innovative Properties Company in St. Paul, Minnesota, where he is responsible for managing the global intellectual property assets of 3M Company and its worldwide affiliates. Mr. Rhodes currently serves as the President of the Intellectual Property Owner's Association. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Intellectual Property Owner's Association Education Foundation and the Executive Committee of the Association of Corporate Patent Counsel. He is a past member of the Board of Directors of the American Intellectual Property Law Association. Mr. Rhodes serves on the Steering Committee of the Coalition for 21st Century Patent Reform and he has testified before Congress and administrative agencies, and has spoken widely, on issues of intellectual property law and policy. Prior to joining 3M in 2001, Mr. Rhodes was a partner at Kirkland & Ellis in Chicago, where he specialized in intellectual property litigation. During his nine years at Kirkland & Ellis, Mr. Rhodes concentrated his practice on trial and appellate litigation of actions involving claims of patent, trademark and copyright infringement, misappropriation of trade secrets, and related claims. Mr. Rhodes received his J.D., *magna cum laude*, from Northwestern University. He is a registered patent attorney, with an undergraduate degree from Grinnell College.

**McCoy Smith, *Intellectual Property & Open Source Attorney – Intel Corporation***

McCoy Smith handles all IP matters for Intel's Data Center Group. He chaired, for over a decade, Intel's Open Source Legal Practice Group, and is a former co-chair for the Open Source Committee for the Intellectual Property Owner's Association (IPO). He also is on the Editorial Committee of the International Free & Open Source Software Law Review (IFOSSLR). McCoy taught patent bar review for Patent Resources Group from 1999-2008. From 2006-2007, McCoy was an active participant in one of the discussion committees working on the drafting of the GNU General Public License (GPL), version 3, published in June, 2007. He is also the author of the BSD+Patent license, approved by the Open Source Initiative in 2017. Prior to joining Intel in 1999, McCoy was an attorney in private practice at Kenyon & Kenyon in New York, NY and Washington, DC, specializing in IP litigation and patent prosecution. He was also a patent examiner in the U.S. Patent & Trademark Office prior to law school. McCoy is a graduate of University of Virginia (J.D., 1991), Johns Hopkins University (M.L.A., 1989) and Colorado State University (B.S., 1984), and is admitted to practice in New York, California, Oregon and the U.S. Patent & Trademark Office.



**Gideon Myles, *Counsel – Dropbox***

Gideon Myles is Legal Counsel at Dropbox where he specializes in a variety of IP issues, including patents and open source. He leads Dropbox's patent development activities, and oversees the legal side of open source including the use of open source in Dropbox's product and the approval process for open sourcing projects developed at Dropbox. Prior to tackling the legal issues associated with IP, he was a software engineer where he used and contributed to open source software.



**Graham Murnane, *Director, Patents - Murgitroyd***

Graham's expertise is in European patent prosecution, particularly patent oppositions and appeals. Graham spent a number of years as a substantive examiner at the European Patent Office (EPO) in Munich, where he examined engineering applications and served as an opposition division member. Since joining Murgitroyd at their Glasgow office in 1996 he has developed the firm's EPO opposition and appeal practice, and advises clients on both defending their own European patents in opposition, and challenging the patents of competitors, often in combination with litigation in one or more European countries. He has provided patent litigation support in the UK, Germany and the Netherlands. He has advised clients on patent entitlement matters in the UK. His clients include large multinational engineering firms, where he works alongside their in-house patent departments, and smaller businesses, such as manufacturing companies, start-ups and product developers, where he gives clear, commercial advice to companies who may not have their own IP experts. He has successfully prosecuted patent applications and managed opposition disputes in the fields of diesel engines, bicycles, renewable energy, oil and gas production, packaging, advertising display apparatus, hydraulic tools, manufacturing and civil engineering.
