

Summary: Ethics in 2018 includes more than just memorizing the rules. A strong dose of emotional intelligence and strong core values helps to avoid unintended ethics violations. Krish Gupta, Senior Vice President - Dell Technologies



Krish Gupta is Senior Vice President, Intellectual Property and Litigation, for Dell Technologies. Krish leads the litigation and intellectual property teams with worldwide responsibility for managing and resolving business and intellectual property litigation and disputes, providing legal support for and developing the company's policies for patents, trademarks and copyrights, open source and standards, building and managing the patent, trademark and domain portfolios, intellectual property licensing, and driving patent and IP policy efforts.

Krish is a member of the board of directors of the Intellectual Property Owners Association (IPO), a trade association for owners of patents, trademarks, copyrights and trade secrets, and the Northeast Chapter of the Association of

Corporate Counsel, a global legal association that promotes the common professional and business interests of in-house counsel who work for corporations, associations and other private-sector organizations. Krish is a member of the executive committee of the Association of Corporate Patent Counsel (ACPC), a membership association of Chief Intellectual Property Counsel of businesses operating in the United States and a member of the board of the Acton Boxborough United Way. Krish is frequently asked to speak at legal events and forums throughout the U.S. In addition, he has also testified before congressional committees on patent reform legislation three times within the past few years.

Krish holds an MS degree in Electrical Engineering from Clemson University and a JD from Suffolk University Law School.



Michelle Lee – *Former Under Secretary of Commerce and Director of USPTO* The Honorable Michelle K. Lee is the most recent former Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Director of the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO). In this role, she led one of the largest intellectual property offices in the world with 13,000 people and an annual budget of \$3.4 billion. Ms. Lee was also the principal advisor to the President, through the Secretary of Commerce, on domestic and international intellectual property policy. Ms. Lee is the first woman to serve as Director of the USPTO in the country's 220+ year history, and is an advocate for women and girls in science, technology, engineering, math and computers.

Prior to the USPTO, Ms. Lee served as Deputy General Counsel at Google and partner at Fenwick & West. Ms. Lee worked as a computer scientist at Hewlett-Packard Research Laboratories, as well as at the MIT Artificial Intelligence Laboratory.

With her experience in Silicon Valley and Washington, D.C., Ms. Lee has experience advising high-growth, innovative companies with disruptive technologies and business models, particularly those with a need to navigate and shape complex legal and highly regulated landscapes. She currently serves as the Herman Phleger Visiting Professor at Law at Stanford Law School where she teaches a joint engineering and law course on disruptive technologies and their impact on laws and regulations as well as a course on intellectual property law.

She holds a B.S. and an M.S. in electrical engineering and computer science from MIT, as well as a J.D. from Stanford Law School, and wrote her graduate thesis on artificial intelligence at the M.I.T. AI Lab. Ms. Lee clerked on the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit.

Diane Lettelleir, Senior Managing Counsel - JCPenney



Senior Managing Counsel for J. C. Penney Corporation, Inc., is responsible for all patent litigation involving the company. Since joining JCPenney, Diane has handled more than 50 patent disputes. Diane joined JCPenney in 2010 after more than 25 years in private practice focused on intellectual property litigation and portfolio management. While in private practice, Diane represented clients that were patent owners asserting patents against competitors, as well as clients accused of infringement.

Ms. Segers is Deputy General Counsel, Chief Intellectual Property Counsel at FIS, a global leader in financial services technology. Her practice focuses on all aspects of intellectual property protection and issues for the company, including copyright, patent and trademark matters, intellectual property litigation, licensing, acquisitions, transactions and agreements. Prior to FIS, Ms. Segers led the Intellectual Property sections for Arizona Chemical Company, Sabre, Travelocity, and American Airlines.

Tom Mavrakakis is a patent litigator with experience in a wide variety of technology areas including mobile devices and gene targeting.

Tom also focuses his practice on pre-litigation analysis for patent assertions and licensing as well as the analysis of patent portfolios for potential acquisition. He counsels clients on many types of patent-related matters, including patent portfolio development strategy, patent assertions, acquisitions and other pre-litigation strategy. He is adept at performing due diligence on the intellectual property aspects in the corporate acquisition context.

Tom brings a unique perspective to his practice, having worked as Director of Patent Strategy for Apple Inc. during the rollout of the first generation iPhone. There, he managed pre-litigation analysis and conflict resolution for patent assertions, negotiated licenses, managed patent infringement cases, and analyzed patent portfolios for potential acquisition. Marc Adler, Of Counsel - Buchanan Ingersoll & Rooney




