**Presentation Title:** Coaching Boys Into Men

**Presentation Summary:** Coaching Boys Into Men (CBIM) is an evidence-based violence prevention program designed to empower high school coaches to teach their male athletes skills that promote healthy relationships and respect, and support athlete well-being. Coaches that participate in this training will be prepared to lead 12 impactful 15-minute weekly discussions for their teams during the athletics season. These engaging discussions are designed to be incorporated into routine practice schedules using the CBIM Card Series as a structured guide. CBIM has been implemented in all 50 states and more than 10 countries. By leveraging the power of sports, coaches, and community advocates, CBIM can transform the culture of teams, schools, and communities.

**Bio:**

Christian Bonds is a Project Coordinator at the Oklahoma State Department of Health in the Injury Prevention Service. His work includes programs to prevent childhood injury such as violence prevention, concussion prevention in athletics, adverse childhood experiences, and motor vehicle safety. Christian is a certified Coaching Boys Into Men Advocate and has trained many coaches across the state of Oklahoma to implement CBIM. Christian obtained his Master of Public Policy from the College of William & Mary in Virginia and Bachelor of Arts in Public Policy Leadership from the University of Mississippi.
