Minnesota Supreme Court Hits 'Reset' on House

Late Friday afternoon, the Minnesota Supreme Court ruled in favor of the House Democrats and Secretary of State Steve Simon, determining that 68 members must be present to conduct business in the House of Representatives. This is based on the full 134-seat body, regardless of vacancies. As a result, all actions taken by Republicans over the past two weeks are now considered invalid.

In response, House Republicans immediately canceled all scheduled hearings for the week - and we're back to square one. Democrats have made it clear they won't return to the Capitol until there's an agreement on shared power with Republicans. For now, the GOP holds a narrow 67-66 majority in the chamber, which will remain until a special election in March fills the vacated seat in district 40B. This election was originally set for January 28 but was delayed after the Supreme Court found that Governor Walz violated state election law by calling the election prematurely.
