## Speakers:

**Dr. Andrew Koeser, University of Florida** - is an assistant Professor of Landscape Management at the *University of Florida Gulf Coast Research and Education Center* in Hillsborough County. Prior to this position and his last stint in graduate school, Andrew worked at *ISA Headquarters* in Champaign, IL, working his way up to Science and Research Manager in his five years with the organization. Andrew is the Chair of the Education Committee and the *TREEFund Liaison* for the *Florida Chapter ISA*. His past involvement with the *Florida Chapter ISA* included Education Representative, Vice President, President and Immediate Past President in addition to being a member of multiple committees.

**Elisabeth Lango, Eocene Environmental Group** - is an urban forestry consultant with *Eocene Environmental Group*, where she specializes in tree inventories, urban forest planning, and municipal consulting across the United States. A Board Certified Master Arborist, Registered Consulting Arborist, and TRAQ-certified professional, she brings over a decade of arboricultural experience including eight years as a city arborist reviewing new development and redevelopment plans. Her municipal and consulting background gives her firsthand insight into what makes an arborist report useful, defensible, and actionable.

**Ian Wogan, Treasures** - is the President of *Treasures*, a full-service arboricultural firm focused on integrating trees and ecosystems into the built environment. His work spans the full project lifecycle - from arborist reporting and design-phase planning to BMP implementation, construction-phase management, and long-term tree establishment. Ian works closely with developers, municipalities, and design teams to ensure that tree preservation is both practical and successful in real-world conditions. His expertise includes large tree relocation and managing trees during construction, where planning, timing, and execution are critical to long-term outcomes.
