


Family Guide to Choosing Child Care

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN A CHILD CARE PROGRAM

✓ Licensed & Accredited

Make sure the program is licensed by the state. This means it meets health, safety, and quality standards. Many providers also earn national accreditation — a sign of even higher commitment to excellence.

√ Safe, Nurturing Environment

Look for a clean, secure space where children are happy, engaged, and cared for. Ask about safety protocols, check-in procedures, and emergency plans.

√ Trained, Caring Staff

Ask if educators are background-checked and trained in early childhood development, CPR, and first aid. Great programs have low child-to-teacher ratios and staff who truly connect with kids.

✓ Curriculum That Fits Your Family

Every child is unique. So is every program. Look for approaches that match your values — such as play-based learning, Montessori, dual-language immersion, Indigenous-led teaching, or nature-based care.

✓ Nutrition & Wellness

Healthy meals matter! Ask what's served, how meals are prepared, and whether the food reflects your culture and family preferences.

- What is your child-to-teacher ratio?
- What is your approach to learning and play?
- How do you handle discipline and redirection?
- How do you communicate with families?
- What are your hours, fees, and schedule options?
- Are meals and snacks provided?
- How do you celebrate culture and diversity?
