Award Categories

Infrastructure

(Includes: highways, transit, airports, ports, public works, etc.)

- Constructed value less than \$10 Million
- o Constructed value between \$10 Million and \$30 Million
- Constructed value greater than \$30 Million

Buildings (New or Renovation)

(Includes: education, healthcare, research, offices, commercial, residential, hospitality, federal, state, county, city, etc.)

- Constructed value less than \$25 Million
- Constructed value greater than \$25 Million

Eligibility

- Open to all Construction Management Association of America (CMAA) members, and non-members.
- Projects, programs, or program phases must have been constructed in Connecticut and have achieved substantial completion during the period of August 31, 2023 and September 1, 2024.

NOTE: Municipalities, private, and public owners are strongly encouraged to submit applications.

NOTE: Incomplete applications will not be considered. The application and all associated attachments must be submitted electronically. Hard copy applications and attachments will not be considered.

Project Achievement Awards Application Process

All applications and supporting materials must be submitted directly to the CMAA Connecticut Chapter. **Be sure to fill** out the application completely and submit it with all accompanying attachments electronically to <u>awards@ctcmaa.starchapter.com</u> no later than midnight, October 17, 2024. See the Application Checklist for guidance in assembling your application.

Project Achievement Awards Review Process

1. The CMAA Connecticut Chapter Project Achievement Awards selection committee will review all complete applications received and make its recommendations to the CMAA Connecticut Chapter Board of Directors for approval. Selected winners will be notified on or about November 1, 2024.

While not mandatory, the Project Achievement nominees are strongly encouraged to attend the CMAA Awards and Scholarship Dinner on November 21, 2024, at The Aqua Turf Club in Southington, CT, where they will be recognized for their outstanding work. Award winners will be presented with an award.
