

## Leadership Beaverton Completed Service Projects

- The 1999 class built the first Habitat for Humanity home in Beaverton.
- The class of 2002 planned Senior PALs Day, an open house at the Beaverton Police Activities League for PAL youth members and local senior citizens, to foster relationships between youth and seniors.
- The class of 2005 worked to produce a public awareness campaign about IgiveWhereIlive.net – a community resource that connects people in Washington County to local charities to keep our giving local!
- The class of 2006 worked for the Oregon Food Bank and has raised \$6,000 for the Care-to-Share backpack program to purchase and supply an additional 300 backpacks for needy students in the Beaverton School District.
- The 2008 class is working on a variety of ways to raise dollars for the Homeless Youth Program for the Beaverton School District. Join them by supporting their efforts through the Tualatin Hills Parks Foundation June 14th Hike-n-Bike. Bike, hike, walk or pledge your support.
- 2009 has created TAKE CARE OF BEAVERTON week – May 4 – 9th. They are collecting goods for Sunshine Pantry, Beaverton Clothes Closet, and Elsie Stuhr Center.
- The class of 2010 did 3 projects! Boxers for Beaverton (supporting St. Mary’s Home for Boys & the BSD Homeless Youth program), Adopted room at the Good Neighbor Center, and the Domestic Violence Resource Center’s Monika’s House!
- The class of 2011 project was “The Awning of a New Day” – they raised over \$40,000 to build a permanent canopy structure to keep customers of the Beaverton Family Resource Center and Beaverton Clothes Closet of the BSD to ensure a comfortable environment – out of the rain, snow, and sunshine – for those in need. - The 2012 class hosted Home Runs for Homeless Youth, a Kickball Tournament that raised more than \$13,000 for a HomePlate Youth Services hosted drop-in center in Beaverton. The first-class project for the Class of 2012 was the amazing Library of more than 1,500 books and bookcases installed at the Beaverton Salvation Veteran’s Home & Family Center.
- The Class of 2013 helped to produce the newly relaunched Beaverton PAL’s fundraiser dinner and auction, raising more than \$14,000 for the organization. The Class of 2014 raised money to build an expansive outdoor animal care area at Monika’s House for the DVRC. The total monies raised were \$21,123 and hundreds of man-hours donated to the planning and construction. The Class of 2015 created a campaign – “Change for Beaverton” raising over \$10,000 for SARC, BEF, HomePlate, and
- The Class of 2016 created, hosted, and executed “Beaverton Awareness Day”. Over 40 non-profits participated in a tabling event showcasing the amazing work they do in Beaverton and recruited volunteers and resources. The 4-hour event boasted over 2,500 guests that came through and learned about the needs in our community.
- The Class of 2017 purchased school supplies for all of the students at the newly rebuilt Vose Elementary School to ensure this Title 1 school opened with a fresh and fabulous start for these special students.
