The refinery will get all its crude oil from domestic and Venezuelan sources. Two tankers already have discharged crude oil cargoes at the refinery's York River pier.

The tank farm, already completed, has a total capacity of 3,770,000 barrels of crude oil and finished product.

Bigamist, Check Artist Is Arrested

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Aug. 24 (INS)—The FBI arrested a dapper 26-year-old forger in Jacksonville today who freely confessed to passing \$40,000-to-\$50,000 in bad checks during the past six months and marrying three girls without bothering to get a divorce.

William Hall Stephens, Alias Lt. Le Grande Tatum and Ether K. Rafterly, was picked up outside a medical building by agents acting on a tip he was in town.

Stephens, originally from Wilmington, N. C. and wanted in numerous cities across the nation, appeared before a U. S. Commissioner late today and indicated he will waive grand jury proceedings and plead guilty to all charges placed against him.

He was originally charged with interstate transportation of bogus checks, interstate transportation of a stolen motor vehicle and impersonating Navy and Army officers.

On the basis of his statement, content of which was disclosed at the hearing, additional charges—including bigamy—are expected to be filed.
